Item II: Approval of Last Meeting's Minutes

Approve Last Meeting's Minutes

Item III: Committee Presentations

• Jamie Lowe

Mrs. Lowe presented about her move to Groveland and experiencing culture shock while transitioning from city life to a smaller agrarian city. Her vision for Groveland is to have a strong educational system, amenities within city limits, walkable communities and transit methods, local shops and restaurants (e.g., farm-to-table), and stronger relationships between merchants and community members.

Keith Keogh

Mr. Keogh presented on the future of technology in food systems and delivery services. He shared his vision for a community with common kitchens, rooftop gardens and vertical farming, town squares (like Sonoma) with small shops that are a part of a bigger entity, cutting edge technological infrastructure, and a need for collaboration with growers. He explains the distinction between indulgent and escapist culture.

Kim Jemison

Mrs. Jemison presented about her experience growing up in St. Petersburg, Florida, starting her business in Las Angeles, and her move to Groveland. Based on her experiences, she understands the need for cultivating racial and cultural diversity in our community. Her vision for Groveland entails affordable housing, strong educational systems, access to healthcare facilities, walkable

communities, renewable energy sources, rooftop and community gardens, and increasing equal access to and affordability of these resources.

• Dr. Roland Nunez

Dr. Nunez presented trends in our educational school systems, including a lack of academic focus due to teachers tending to emotional needs of students, rapid adoption of technology, transition from digital learning, shift to problem-solving and hands-on learning, increase in micro-credentialing, shifting mindsets in generational labeling. He emphasized the importance of having new school development to meet a growing city's needs. He suggests investment in business technology and educational programs, partnering with organizations, and investing in our youth.

• Dr. Tony McCoy

Dr. McCoy presented his vision of Groveland by sharing his values: partnership, respect, purpose, encourage, build, serve, and give. He relates these values to his vision for Groveland. He would like to see a community focus on health and well-being, cultivating collective strengths to build a thriving community, embracing change, and capturing a home-town feel.
