This tutorial is for a Mini Slimline card that measures 3 1/2" x 7".

• Supplies Needed:

- Although I used copy paper to create the template, my finished envelope is made with lightweight cardstock. I believe it's 60lb weight. It's much thinner than the standard Basic White cardstock from Stampin' Up!. It scored nicely and gave the envelope more substance than regular copy paper.
- A scoring tool or Paper Trimmer with scoring blade.
- Paper Snips or regular scissors.
- A corner round punch.
- · Stampin' Seal or your favorite adhesive.

The paper size to complete the envelope is one 8 1/2" x 11" sheet.

- On the 8 1/2" side, score at 2 1/4" and 6".
- On the 11" side, score at 1 3/4" and 9".
- Burnish all score lines and cut out the four corners at the score lines.

- Fold both sides in toward the center and attach with your favorite adhesive. I used Stampin' Seal.
- With the corner round punch, I rounded the corners of the bottom and top tabs.
- · See photos below.



• I created a little envelope liner from a piece of patterned paper cut 3" x 2.5"

- With the corner round punch, I rounded the top two corners and slipped the "liner" into the top of the envelope.
- This gave the envelope a nice, finished look.
