

**PARTICIPATING ADDENDUM
NASPO VALUEPOINT COOPERATIVE PURCHASING PROGRAM
Laboratory Equipment and Supplies
Administered by the State of Idaho (hereinafter "Lead State")**

(hereinafter "Contractor")

And

State of Wyoming
(hereinafter "Participating State")

1. Scope: This Participating Addendum (PADD) covers the Laboratory Equipment and Supplies contract led by the State of Idaho (Master Agreement No. MA16000234-1) for use by state agencies and other entities located in the Participating State, as provided below.

2. Participation: Use of NASPO ValuePoint cooperative contracts by agencies, political subdivisions and other entities authorized by an individual state's statutes to use State contracts are subject to the prior approval of the respective State Chief Procurement Official. Issues of interpretation and eligibility for participation are solely within the authority of the State Chief Procurement Official.

3. Order of Precedence:

1. A Participating Entity's Participating Addendum ("PA"); A Participating Entity's Participating Addendum shall not diminish, change, or impact the rights of the Lead State with regard to the Lead State's contractual relationship with the Contract Vendor under the Terms of Idaho NASPO ValuePoint Master Agreement
2. Idaho NASPO ValuePoint Master Agreement (includes negotiated Terms & Conditions)
3. The Solicitation including all Addendums; and Contract Vendor's response to the Solicitation

These documents shall be read to be consistent and complementary. Any conflict among these documents shall be resolved by giving priority to these documents in the order listed above. Contract Vendor terms and conditions that apply to this Master Agreement are only those that are expressly accepted by the Lead State and must be in writing and attached to the Master Agreement as an Exhibit or Attachment. No other terms and conditions shall apply, including terms and conditions listed in the Contract Vendor's response to the Solicitation, or terms listed or referenced on the Contract Vendor's website, in the Contract Vendor quotation/sales order or in similar documents subsequently provided by the Contract Vendor. The solicitation language prevails unless a mutually agreed exception has been negotiated




5. Terms. The Participating State/Entity is agreeing to the terms of the Master Agreement only to the extent the terms are not in conflict with applicable law.



EXHIBIT A
Wyoming General Conditions

This Exhibit A, Wyoming General Conditions, supplements and replaces terms and conditions contained in Idaho WSCA-NASPO Master Agreement – Number MA16000234-1, dated March 22, 2016, and Participating Addendum for NASPO Valuepoint Cooperative Purchasing Program Laboratory Equipment and Supplies (collectively referred to as “Agreement”) entered into between Fisher Scientific Company LLC (“Contractor”) and the State of Wyoming (“State”). In the event of any inconsistencies between the terms and conditions contained in the Agreement and this Exhibit A, the terms and conditions in this Exhibit A shall control and shall supersede and replace the terms contained in the Agreement.

The following provisions contained in the Agreement are modified: Attachment A. NASPO ValuePoint Master Agreement Terms and Conditions: Section 14, Indemnification, applies to the extent allowable by Wyoming law; and Section 23, Payment, shall be amended to read: Payment for completion of an Agreement order shall be made within 45 days upon the submission of invoice pursuant to Wyo. Stat. § 16-6-602.

The following General Conditions are made part of the Agreement:

1. **Amendments.** Any changes, modifications, revisions or amendments to this Agreement which are mutually agreed upon by the parties to this Agreement shall be incorporated by written instrument, executed and signed by all parties to this Agreement.
2. **Applicable Law/Venue.** The construction, interpretation and enforcement of this Agreement shall be governed by the laws of the State of Wyoming. The Courts of the State of Wyoming shall have jurisdiction over this Agreement and the parties, and the venue shall be the First Judicial District, Laramie County, Wyoming.
3. **Agreement Not Used as Collateral.** The Contractor shall not use this Agreement, or any portion thereof, for collateral for any financial obligation, without the prior written permission of the Agency.
4. **Assumption of Risk.** The Contractor shall be responsible for any loss of state or federal funding, either administrative or program dollars, due to Contractor's failure to comply with state or federal requirements. The Agency shall notify the Contractor of any state or federal determination of noncompliance.
5. **Award of Related Agreements.** The Agency may undertake or award supplemental or successor Agreements for work related to this Agreement. The Contractor shall cooperate fully with other Contractors and the Agency in all such cases.
6. **Confidentiality of Information.** All documents, data compilations, reports, computer

programs, photographs, data and other work provided to or produced by the Contractor in the performance of this Agreement shall be kept confidential by the Contractor unless written permission is granted by the Agency for its release. If and when Contractor receives a request for information subject to this Agreement, Contractor shall notify Agency within ten (10) days of such request and not release such information to a third party unless directed to do so by Agency.

7. **Force Majeure.** Neither party shall be liable for failure to perform under this Agreement if such failure to perform arises out of causes beyond the control and without the fault or negligence of the nonperforming party. Such causes may include, but are not limited to, acts of God or the public enemy, fires, floods, epidemics, quarantine restrictions, freight embargoes, and unusually severe weather. This provision shall become effective only if the party failing to perform immediately notifies the other party of the extent and nature of the problem, limits delay in performance to that required by the event, and takes all reasonable steps to minimize delays. This provision shall not be effective unless the failure to perform is beyond the control and without the fault or negligence of the nonperforming party.
8. **Independent Contractor.** The Contractor shall function as an independent Contractor for the purposes of this Agreement, and shall not be considered an employee of the State of Wyoming for any purpose. Consistent with the express terms of this Agreement, the Contractor shall be free from control or direction over the details of the performance of services under this Contract. The Contractor shall assume sole responsibility for any debts or liabilities that may be incurred by the Contractor in fulfilling the terms of this Agreement, and shall be solely responsible for the payment of all federal, state and local taxes which may accrue because of this Agreement. Nothing in this Agreement shall be interpreted as authorizing the Contractor or its agents and/or employees to act as an agent or representative for or on behalf of the State of Wyoming or the Agency, or to incur any obligation of any kind on the behalf of the State of Wyoming or the Agency. The Contractor agrees that no health/hospitalization benefits, workers' compensation, unemployment insurance and/or similar benefits available to State of Wyoming employees will inure to the benefit of the Contractor or the Contractor's agents and/or employees as a result of this Contract.
9. **Nondiscrimination.** The Contractor shall comply with Presidential Executive Order 11246 entitled, "Equal Employment Opportunity," as amended by Presidential Executive Order 11375, and as supplemented in the Department of Labor Regulations (41 CFR Part 60), the Civil Rights Act of 1964, the Wyoming Fair Employment Practices Act (Wyo. Stat. § 27-9-105 *et seq.*), and the Americans With Disabilities Act (ADA), 42 U.S.C. 12101, *et seq.* The Contractor shall assure that no person is discriminated against based on the grounds of sex, race, religion, national origin or disability in connection with the performance of this Agreement.

10. **Prior Approval.** This Agreement shall not be binding upon either party, no services shall be performed under the terms of this Agreement, and the Wyoming State Auditor shall not draw warrants for payment on this Agreement, until this Agreement has been reduced to writing, approved as to form by the Office of the Attorney General, filed with and approved by the Department of Administration and Information, and approved by the Governor of the State of Wyoming if required by Wyo. Stat. § 9-2-1016(b)(iv)(D).
11. **Severability.** Should any portion of this Agreement be judicially determined to be illegal or unenforceable, the remainder of the Agreement shall continue in full force and effect, and either party may renegotiate the terms affected by the severance.
12. **Sovereign Immunity.** The State of Wyoming and the Agency do not waive sovereign immunity by entering into this Agreement, and specifically retain immunity and all defenses available to them as sovereigns pursuant to Wyo. Stat. § 1-39-104(a) and all other state law.
13. **Taxes.** The Contractor shall pay all taxes and other such amounts required of the Contractor by federal, state and local law, including but not limited to federal and social security taxes, workers' compensation, unemployment insurance and sales taxes.
14. **Third Party Beneficiary Rights.** With the exception of agencies or other governmental entities in the State of Wyoming that are entitled to participate in this Agreement, the parties do not intend to create in any other individual or entity the status of third party beneficiary, and this Agreement shall not be construed so as to create such status. The rights, duties and obligations contained in this Agreement shall operate only between the parties to this Agreement, and shall inure solely to the benefit of the parties to this Agreement. The provisions of this Agreement are intended only to assist the parties in determining and performing their obligations under this Agreement. The parties to this Agreement intend and expressly agree that only parties entitled to the benefit of this Agreement through the State's signatory to this Agreement shall have any legal or equitable right to seek to enforce this Agreement, to seek any remedy arising out of a party's performance or failure to perform any term or condition of this Agreement, or to bring an action for the breach of this Agreement.
15. **Titles Not Controlling.** Titles of paragraphs are for reference only, and shall not be used to construe the language in this Agreement.
