ATTACHMENT A PARTICIPATING ADDENDUM

For: The State of Alabama Under the NASPO ValuePoint Master Agreement Copiers, Printers and Related Devices, (Nevada RFP 3091)

Administrative Fee:

Contract vendors are required to pay the State an administrative fee for all sales made under this contract. This fee will be ONE percent (1.0%) of the total dollar amount of sales. The contract vendor is required to submit electronic documentation of all sales made during a reporting month. The fee and reporting must be submitted each month before the 20th and will represent a single, one-time payment for all sales made in the prior month and as adjusted for errors associated with earlier months. This fee is not to be listed as a separate cost on invoices. Failure to submit reports and fees on a timely basis shall constitute grounds for suspension of this agreement. This information must be submitted as outlined below:

<u>Utilization Reports – Monthly</u>

A report is due even when there is no sales activity. The reports shall be sent electronically to: <u>telecom.admin@isd.alabama.gov</u>.

The report shall include the following data:

- 1. Contract Number (State Master Agreement number)
- 2. Reporting Month and Year
- 3. Agency or local government entity
- 4. Product(s) purchased
- 5. Sales grand totals for reporting month
- 6. The Administrative Fee Dollar amount for reporting month

Fee Submission – Monthly

The remittance is to be identified by the contract number and reporting month. A copy of utilization report should also be submitted with the fee payment. Remittance is to be made payable to the "State of Alabama, Department of Finance" and sent to the following address:

SPECIAL TERMS AND CONDITIONS

Purpose:

The State of Alabama desires to adjoin for Copiers in Group A and Group B only as awarded per the NASPO ValuePoint Master Agreement 3091. The agreement will commence on or after October 1, 2017.

Mandatory Source:

All State agencies must use this contract, as established through the Division of Purchasing. State agencies that have their own procurement authority have the option to utilize this contract. This contract may also be available to local governments.

Choice of Law, Venue:

This contract will be governed by the laws of the State of Alabama and the sole venue for litigation and alternative dispute resolution activities will be the City of Montgomery in the State of Alabama.

Not to Constitute a Debt to the State:

The terms and commitments contained in this master agreement shall not constitute a debt to the State of Alabama, in the incurring of which is prohibited by Section 213 of the Office Recompilation of the Constitution of Alabama, 1901, as amended by Amendment No. 26.

Contract Length:

Section 41-16-27, Code of Alabama 1975 states that contracts for the purchase of personal property or contractual services other than personal services shall be let by competitive bid for periods not greater than five years. This agreement shall not exceed the original terms of the contract/agreement nor shall it exceed five (5) years whichever comes first.

Vendor Subscription:

Contract vendors must maintain a Vendor Self Service (VSS) profile and be actively subscribed and remain active with State Purchasing for the life of the contract. Subscriptions may be completed by following the "Pay Subscription Fee" link at https://procurement.staars.alabama.gov or follow the Vendor Self Service link at www.purchasing.alabama.gov.

Alabama Immigration Law:

Contract vendor must comply with the requirements of the Beason-Hammon Alabama Taxpayer and Citizen Protection Act (Act 2011-535) and as amended by Act 2012-491. See page 4 of Attachment A.

Disclosure Statement:

Section 41-16-82, Code of Alabama 1975 requires the disclosure statement to be completed and filed with all proposals, bids, contracts, or grant proposals to the State of Alabama in excess of \$5,000. In circumstances where a contract is awarded by

competitive bid, the disclosure statement shall be required only from the person receiving the contract and shall be submitted within ten (10) days of the award.

Late Payments:

Penalty for agencies paying invoices late may not exceed the rate charged by State of Alabama Comptroller's Office.

Non-appropriation of funds:

Continuation of any agreement between the State and a bidder beyond a fiscal year is contingent upon continued legislative appropriation of funds for the purpose of this bid and any resulting agreement. Non-availability of funds at any time shall cause any agreement to become void and unenforceable and no liquidated damages shall accrue to the state as a result. The State will not incur liability beyond the payment of accrued agreement payment.

Proration:

Any provision of a contract resulting from this bid to the contrary notwithstanding, in the event of failure of the State to make payment hereunder as a result of partial unavailability, at the time such payment is due, of such sufficient revenues of the State to make such payment (proration of appropriated funds for the State having been declared by the governor pursuant to Section 41-4-90 of the Code of Alabama 1975), the contractor shall have the option, in addition to the other remedies of the contract, of renegotiating the contract (extending or changing payment terms or amounts) or terminating the contract.

Purchase Orders and Invoices:

All contract users will issue orders directly to the awarded manufacturer only. Manufacturers will invoice directly. Contract users will not pay local dealers.

According to the Code of Alabama, Section 40-12-222, the four percent (4%) lease tax levied shall not apply to leasing or rental of tangible personal property to the State, Municipality or County in the State unless the flat amount collected by the lessor includes both the leasing fee and the tax.

Local Authorized Dealers:

Manufacturers will use local authorized dealers to install and maintain. All dealers should be located within Alabama. The State may allow out of state dealers IF there are no instate dealers located within a 60-mile radius of a contract user.

Attachment B State of Alabama SERVICE LEVEL AGREEMENT (SLA)

The purpose of this model Service Level Agreement (SLA) is to provide the Participating Entities and Awarded Vendors with an example of a guarantee of service levels with penalties for failure to perform. This model SLA utilizes a scorecard method for the Customer level SLA and flat rate penalties for the Participating Entity. Awarded Vendors are to negotiate their own SLA with each Participating Entity at time of initiating the Participating Addendum. All parties are cautioned to utilize measurements that are reportable and measurable.

1. Customer Level SLA

1.1 Purpose

The purpose of this addendum is to define service levels; penalties for the performance of the service levels; as well as provide the Customer with a defined replacement process for equipment performing below expectations.

1.2 Customer Service Level Agreement

Vendor agrees to maintain the following service levels defined below as targets:

Performance Criteria	Target Level	
Average Uptime	96% or Better	
Average On-Site Response Time	4 Hours or Less	
First Time Fix	80% of all service calls or better	

These service levels will be measured on a quarterly basis between Vendor and the State.

1.3 Calculation of Service Level Points

Once per quarter, Vendor will produce reporting to be measured against the Service Level Agreement and points will be assigned according to the following chart. These points will be added to produce a total Service Level score. This score will be used to determine the subsequent penalty according to the following schedule where the penalty can be up to 4% of the previous quarter's service and supplies billing (expressed as a negative %).

The penalty shall be awarded to the Customer as a credit on the following period's service and supplies invoice.

1.2 Equipment Performance

Vendor guarantees each machine specified within any maintenance agreement will perform to either a) the monthly copies between service calls as measured by machine on a quarterly basis by group and segment listed below and/or b) the monthly uptime as measured by machine on a quarterly basis by segment listed below.

If any unit fails to maintain this level of performance between calls and or the monthly uptime, excluding service calls caused by operator error that system will be subject to replacement at the Customers discretion on a like-for-like basis with then current technology. Prior to installing a substitute product, supplier will be

allowed 90 days to remedy any quality or reliability issues. A designated factory authorized technician must certify each unit's ability to produce acceptable impressions with acceptable copies between calls or uptime. The guarantee will remain in effect for the term of the contract or up to five (5) years from the date of purchase/lease, provided the equipment has not been subjected to abuse or neglect and has been continuously covered by a Maintenance Contract. This replacement policy will remain in effect for the term of the contract and is subject to the Customer remaining current with supplier's payment requirements.

1.3 Additional Vendor Guarantees

- 1.3.1 **Training** On-going training as requested by the Customer to be performed within two (2) weeks of requested date for on-site training and two (2) hours for phone/technical support. A penalty of \$50 per incident that does not meet the turnaround time specified above to be credited on the next service bill.
- 1.3.2 **Loaner Unit/Backup Production** If any unit is inoperable for a period in excess of 72 hours, Vendor shall provide the Customer with either:
 - i) A loaner unit of similar speed and capabilities until such time as the unit(s) covered by this agreement are operable, or
 - ii) Provide the Customer with off-site manned production capabilities to accomplish the work of the unit that is inoperable at the sole cost of the Vendor. Such costs shall be limited to cost of production (service and supplies), equipment, labor, power, transportation of jobs to and from the off-site production facility and facilities.
- 1.3.3 **Invoicing** Vendor shall maintain timely, accurate invoicing, less service run impressions, as defined below. Failure on the vendor's part to maintain these levels as defined shall result in a \$50.00 per instance credit on the following invoice.

2. Reporting and Billing

- 2.1 **Timely Reporting** See Attachment A for Administrative Fee reporting guidelines. Failure to submit timely will result in a penalty of \$5.00 per work day beyond the set guidelines.
- 2.2 **Timely Payment of Administrative Fees** See Attachment A for Administrative Fee payment guidelines. Failure to submit timely will result in a penalty of \$5.00 per work day beyond the set guidelines.
- 2.3 Accuracy of Reporting The State may request at any point proof of the reporting accuracy through the data set supporting the reporting. If the State has reason to believe that multiple and systemic reporting errors exist, that cannot be corrected to the State's satisfaction; the State may require an audit by a third party. If errors are found, the Successful vendor must reimburse the State for the cost of the auditor as well as correcting any administrative fee errors.
- 2.4 **Accuracy of Billing** The State may request at any point proof of the billing accuracy through the data set supporting the billing. If the State has reason to believe that multiple and systemic billing errors exist, that cannot be corrected to the State's satisfaction; the State may require an audit by a third party. If errors are found, the Successful vendor must reimburse the State for the cost of the auditor as well as correcting any billing errors.
- 2.5 **Penalties** All penalties under this, section two (2) of the Service Level Agreement, shall be payable to the State.
- 2.6 For items 2.1-2.5 The non-defaulting party shall give the defaulting party thirty (30) calendar days from receipt of notice to cure said default.

State of Alabama - Additional Terms

Warrantv

All warranty terms set forth in the original RFP, including amendments, and subsequent award(s) are hereby incorporated into this SLA and Participating Addendum. This includes a minimum 90-warranty on all equipment leased or purchased from this agreement.

Purchasing Options

Option 1 - Contract users may lease equipment and any necessary accessories for a term of 36-month fixed. There will be no buy-out option at the end of the 36 months. The Contractor will pick up the equipment. The contract user will procure new equipment from the manufacturer of their choice.

Option 2 - Contract users may purchase equipment and any necessary accessories outright.

All equipment procured from this agreement must be new or newly manufactured as outlined in the original RFP.

Maintenance

The Contractor shall provide maintenance options for leased and purchased equipment to include but not limited to cost per copy with no built in usage, minimum monthly usage fixed rate plus cost per copy overage rates, etc. At the contract user's request, Contractor shall provide assistance in determining the "best value" maintenance plan. Maintenance shall cover everything except paper and staples.

Maintenance Service shall be available during normal business hours, 8:00 AM to 5:00 PM, Monday through Friday, except State and/or Federal holidays.

All technicians must be factory trained by the manufacturer. The State reserves the right to request documentation or verification of said training.

If a contract user purchases equipment but does not opt for a maintenance contract, all expendable parts must be guaranteed for the manufacturer's stated life, i.e. drums – 50,000 copies, etc. If the part is guaranteed for a specific life and it fails to meet that level, the part must be replaced. There will be a pro-rated sharing of the cost of parts and labor, i.e. if the part is guaranteed for 50,000 copies but fails at only 25,000 copies, the contract user would be entitled to a 50% credit on the parts and labor to bring the equipment back to industry standard operations.

Insurance/Risk of Loss

For leased equipment, the contract user shall be relieved from risks of loss or damage to all equipment during transportation, installation and during the entire time the equipment is in their possession except when the loss or damage is due to the fault or negligence of that user. The leased equipment should be insured by the Contractor at full replacement value against risk of loss or damage.
