1. Scope: This Participating Addendum ("PA") covers the NASPO ValuePoint Wireless, Data, Voice and Accessories Master Agreement led by the State of Utah (Master Agreement No: MA176-1) for use by state agencies and other entities, as provided in the Master Agreement, and as more specifically detailed in Paragraph 2, "Participation," below. There were four categories included in the solicitation:

Category 1: Cellular Wireless Services

Category 2: Equipment and Accessories

Category 3: Turnkey Wireless and IoT Solutions offered as a Product

Category 4: Alternative Wireless Transport Options

Contractor was awarded Categories 1, 2, 3A, and 3C.

Participating Entity has elected to participate in ***all awarded categories with Contractor. Whenever the Master Agreement is updated, changed, amended, or offerings deleted or added those items shall automatically be applicable to this Participating Addendum. Contractor is to notify the State of Kansas primary contact when such changes occur, however the Contractor and Participating Entity do not need to amend this document for these items to take effect.***

2. Participation: This PA may be used by all state agencies, institutions of higher education, political subdivisions and other entities who are authorized by the State Chief Procurement Official or otherwise eligible to place orders against this PA (collectively "Purchasing Entities"). It will be the responsibility of the Purchasing Entity to comply with any legal or regulatory provisions applicable to the Purchasing Entity. A Purchasing Entity may issue individual releases (Purchase Orders) against this PA on an as-needed basis.

3. Participating Entity Modifications or Additions are as follows:

- a. *Travel expenses, if applicable, shall be reimbursed under the same rates and conditions as noted in the "Employee Travel Expense Reimbursement Handbook" found at: <https://admin.ks.gov/offices/chief-financial-officer/travel-information-for-state-employees> unless otherwise agreed upon with the Purchasing Entity.*
- b. *Leasing is outside the scope of this Participating Addendum unless authorized by the State's Chief Procurement Officer for an individual order.*

- c. Upon request of the Purchasing Entity, the Contractor shall accept a Business Procurement Card (BPC) or other like instrument in lieu of a warrant for payment under this agreement. No additional charges will be allowed for using the P-Card.
  - d. This contract is not an exclusive contract. The State of Kansas is not precluded from the purchase of goods and services from other sources.
  - e. A State of Kansas, Tax Clearance Certificate is required to execute this Addendum.
  - f. The contractor shall sign and submit a "Policy Regarding Sexual Harassment Acknowledgment form" per Executive Order 18-04. This form is required to execute this Addendum.
  - g. The contractor shall sign and submit a "Boycott of Israel certification Form" per HB 2482, 2018 Legislature. This form is required to execute this Addendum.

4. Order of Precedence: Except as specifically provided otherwise herein, this PA consists of and precedence is established by the order of the following documents:

State of Kansas Contractual Provisions Attachment, DA-146a;  
This PA, and;  
The Master Agreement (including the Master Agreement Order of Precedence established in the NASPO ValuePoint Master Terms and Conditions).

5. Administrative Fee and Reporting:

The Contractor shall submit calendar quarterly reports to the Division of Purchases for all invoiced sales and services ("actual, net invoice sales"), made under this Addendum.

This report should include as a minimum the agency name, quantity, description and amount. The report will be provided electronically, and a check sent payable to the State of Kansas – Office of Procurement and Contracts for an amount equal to one percent (1.0%) of the total actual sales. The report and fee shall be submitted 60 days following the end of the calendar quarter to [reports@da.ks.gov](mailto:reports@da.ks.gov) as follows:

- o Quarter #1: July 1st through September 30th, due by November 30th
- o Quarter #2: October 1st through December 31st, due by February 28th
- o Quarter #3: January 1st through March 31st, due by May 31st
- o Quarter #4: April 1st through June 30th, due by August 31st

*E.g. Master Agreement requires that Contractor provide Participating Entities with specific equipment sales summaries at no additional cost; as well as custom reports (usage reports which include full itemization of call details, such as the information on the Contractor's standard bill for Participating Entities' accounts, to enable verification of usage including: (1) call date, call number, call length, call time, and (2) plan cost, per minute charges, overage cost, additional features charges and other fees, etc.*

*Administrative Fees shall be incorporated into the quoted unit prices of this agreement.*

6. Purchase Order Instructions:

*The contractor acknowledges the assigned State of Kansas contract number is: 000000000000000000047503. No other special instructions apply.*

7. Individual Customer:

*Each state agency, political subdivision or other entity placing an order under this Participating Addendum ("Purchasing Entity"), will be treated as if it was an Individual Customer. Except to the extent modified in this Participating Addendum, each agency, political subdivision or other entity will be responsible for compliance with the terms and conditions of the Master Agreement; and they will have the same rights and responsibilities for their purchases as the Lead State has in the Master Agreement. Each agency, political subdivision or other entity will be responsible for its own charges, fees and liabilities. Each Purchasing Entity will have the same rights to any indemnity or to recover any costs allowed in the contract for its purchases; and Contractor will apply the charges to each Participating Entity individually. The Individual Customer agrees to the terms of the Participating Addendum, including the disclosure of limited account information as part of the contractual reporting requirements to NASPO ValuePoint and/or the Participating Entity for purposes of monitoring the contract and calculating the administrative fee.*


10. Entire Agreement:



### CONTRACTUAL PROVISIONS ATTACHMENT

Important: This form contains mandatory contract provisions and must be attached to or incorporated in all copies of any contractual agreement. If it is attached to the vendor/contractor's standard contract form, then that form must be altered to contain the following provision:

The Provisions found in Contractual Provisions Attachment (Form DA-146a, Rev. 07-19), which is attached hereto, are hereby incorporated in this contract and made a part thereof.

The parties agree that the following provisions are hereby incorporated into the contract to which it is attached and made a part thereof, said contract being the 23<sup>rd</sup> day of December, 2019.

1. **Terms Herein Controlling Provisions:** It is expressly agreed that the terms of each and every provision in this attachment shall prevail and control over the terms of any other conflicting provision in any other document relating to and a part of the contract in which this attachment is incorporated. Any terms that conflict or could be interpreted to conflict with this attachment are nullified.
2. **Kansas Law and Venue:** This contract shall be subject to, governed by, and construed according to the laws of the State of Kansas, and jurisdiction and venue of any suit in connection with this contract shall reside only in courts located in the State of Kansas.
3. **Termination Due To Lack Of Funding Appropriation:** If, in the judgment of the Director of Accounts and Reports, Department of Administration, sufficient funds are not appropriated to continue the function performed in this agreement and for the payment of the charges hereunder, State may terminate this agreement at the end of its current fiscal year. State agrees to give written notice of termination to contractor at least thirty (30) days prior to the end of its current fiscal year and shall give such notice for a greater period prior to the end of such fiscal year as may be provided in this contract, except that such notice shall not be required prior to ninety (90) days before the end of such fiscal year. Contractor shall have the right, at the end of such fiscal year, to take possession of any equipment provided State under the contract. State will pay to the contractor all regular contractual payments incurred through the end of such fiscal year, plus contractual charges incidental to the return of any such equipment. Upon termination of the agreement by State, title to any such equipment shall revert to contractor at the end of the State's current fiscal year. The termination of the contract pursuant to this paragraph shall not cause any penalty to be charged to the agency or the contractor.
4. **Disclaimer Of Liability:** No provision of this contract will be given effect that attempts to require the State of Kansas or its agencies to defend, hold harmless, or indemnify any contractor or third party for any acts or omissions. The liability of the State of Kansas is defined under the Kansas Tort Claims Act (K.S.A. 75-6101, *et seq.*).
5. **Anti-Discrimination Clause:** The contractor agrees: (a) to comply with the Kansas Act Against Discrimination (K.S.A. 44-1001, *et seq.*) and the Kansas Age Discrimination in Employment Act (K.S.A. 44-1111, *et seq.*) and the applicable provisions of the Americans With Disabilities Act (42 U.S.C. 12101, *et seq.*) (ADA), and Kansas Executive Order No. 19-02, and to not discriminate against any person because of race, color, gender, sexual orientation, gender identity or expression, religion, national origin, ancestry, age, military or veteran status, disability status, marital or family status, genetic information, or political affiliation that is unrelated to the person's ability to reasonably perform the duties of a particular job or position; (b) to include in all solicitations or advertisements for employees, the phrase "equal opportunity employer"; (c) to comply with the reporting requirements set out at K.S.A. 44-1031 and K.S.A. 44-1116; (d) to

include those provisions in every subcontract or purchase order so that they are binding upon such subcontractor or vendor; (e) that a failure to comply with the reporting requirements of (c) above or if the contractor is found guilty of any violation of such acts by the Kansas Human Rights Commission, such violation shall constitute a breach of contract and the contract may be cancelled, terminated or suspended, in whole or in part, by the contracting state agency or the Kansas Department of Administration; (f) Contractor agrees to comply with all applicable state and federal anti-discrimination laws and regulations; (g) Contractor agrees all hiring must be on the basis of individual merit and qualifications, and discrimination or harassment of persons for the reasons stated above is prohibited; and (h) if it is determined that the contractor has violated the provisions of any portion of this paragraph, such violation shall constitute a breach of contract and the contract may be canceled, terminated, or suspended, in whole or in part, by the contracting state agency or the Kansas Department of Administration.

6. **Acceptance of Contract:** This contract shall not be considered accepted, approved or otherwise effective until the statutorily required approvals and certifications have been given.
7. **Arbitration, Damages, Warranties:** Notwithstanding any language to the contrary, no interpretation of this contract shall find that the State or its agencies have agreed to binding arbitration, or the payment of damages or penalties. Further, the State of Kansas and its agencies do not agree to pay attorney fees, costs, or late payment charges beyond those available under the Kansas Prompt Payment Act (K.S.A. 75-6403), and no provision will be given effect that attempts to exclude, modify, disclaim or otherwise attempt to limit any damages available to the State of Kansas or its agencies at law, including but not limited to, the implied warranties of merchantability and fitness for a particular purpose.
8. **Representative's Authority to Contract:** By signing this contract, the representative of the contractor thereby represents that such person is duly authorized by the contractor to execute this contract on behalf of the contractor and that the contractor agrees to be bound by the provisions thereof.
9. **Responsibility for Taxes:** The State of Kansas and its agencies shall not be responsible for, nor indemnify a contractor for, any federal, state or local taxes which may be imposed or levied upon the subject matter of this contract.
10. **Insurance:** The State of Kansas and its agencies shall not be required to purchase any insurance against loss or damage to property or any other subject matter relating to this contract, nor shall this contract require them to establish a "self-insurance" fund to protect against any such loss or damage. Subject to the provisions of the Kansas Tort Claims Act (K.S.A. 75-6101, *et seq.*), the contractor shall bear the risk of any loss or damage to any property in which the contractor holds title.
11. **Information:** No provision of this contract shall be construed as limiting the Legislative Division of Post Audit from having access to information pursuant to K.S.A. 46-1101, *et seq.*
12. **The Eleventh Amendment:** "The Eleventh Amendment is an inherent and incumbent protection with the State of Kansas and need not be reserved, but prudence requires the State to reiterate that nothing related to this contract shall be deemed a waiver of the Eleventh Amendment."
13. **Campaign Contributions / Lobbying:** Funds provided through a grant award or contract shall not be given or received in exchange for the making of a campaign contribution. No part of the funds provided through this contract shall be used to influence or attempt to influence an officer or employee of any State of Kansas agency or a member of the Legislature regarding any pending legislation or the awarding, extension, continuation, renewal, amendment or modification of any government contract, grant, loan, or cooperative agreement.
