This Participating Addendum incorporates all terms and conditions of the Master Agreement as applied to the Participating Entity and Contractor, subject to the following limitations. modifications, and additions:

The Contractor shall be reimbursed by the Procuring Agency for applicable New Mexico gross receipts taxes, excluding interest or penalties assessed on the Contractor by any authority. Contractor shall require all subcontractors to hold the Procuring Agency harmless from any responsibility for taxes, damages, and interest, if applicable, contributions required under Federal and/or state and local laws and regulations and any other costs, including transaction privilege taxes. unemployment compensation insurance, Social Security, and Worker's Compensation.

7. **Term:**

THIS PARTICIPATING ADDENDUM SHALL NOT BECOME EFFECTIVE UNTIL APPROVED IN WRITING BY THE STATE PURCHASING AGENT. This Participating Addendum shall begin on date approved by the State Purchasing Agent, and end on December 31, 2024. The Participating Entity reserves the right to renew this Participating Addendum on an annual basis by mutual agreement of the parties not exceed a total of eight (8) years in accordance with NMSA 1978 §13-1-150.

8. <u>Termination</u>:

Grounds. Either party may terminate this Participating Addendum for convenience upon thirty (30) days written notice to the other party. Either party may terminate this Participating Addendum for cause in accordance with sub-paragraph B of this Section 8 below.

В. Notice: Opportunity to Cure.

Except as otherwise provided in sub-paragraph A of this Section 8 and the Appropriations Clause of this Participating Addendum, the non-defaulting party shall

give the defaulting party written notice of termination and an opportunity to cure at least thirty (30) days prior to the intended date of termination.

- 2. A written notice of termination shall (i) identify all the breaches of of the Participating Addendum upon which the termination is based and (ii) state what the defaulting party must do to cure such breaches. Termination shall only be effective (i) if the defaulting party does not cure all breaches within the thirty (30) day notice period or (ii) in the case of breaches that cannot be cured within thirty (30) days, the defaulting party does not, within the thirty (30) day notice period, notify the other party of its intent to cure and begin with due diligence to cure the breach.
- 3. Notwithstanding the foregoing, this Participating Addendum may be terminated immediately upon written notice to the Contractor (i) if, during the term of this Participating Addendum, the Contractor is suspended or debarred by the State Purchasing Agent; or (ii) the Participating Addendum is terminated pursuant to the Appropriations Clause of this Participating Addendum.

9. Appropriations:

The terms of this Participating Addendum are contingent upon sufficient appropriations and authorization being made by the Legislature of New Mexico for the performance of this Participating Addendum. If sufficient appropriations and authorization are not made by the Legislature, this Participating Addendum shall terminate immediately upon written notice being given by the Participating Entity to the Contractor. The Participating Entity's decision as to whether sufficient appropriations are available shall be accepted by the Contractor and shall be final. If the Participating Entity proposes an amendment to this Participating Addendum to unilaterally reduce funding, the Contractor shall have the option to terminate this Participating Addendum or to agree to the reduced funding, within thirty (30) days of receipt of the proposed amendment.

10. Status of Contractor:

The Contractor and its agents and employees are independent contractors performing professional or general services for the Participating Entity and are not employees of the State of New Mexico. The Contractor and its agents and employees shall not accrue leave, retirement, insurance, bonding, use of state vehicles, or any other benefits afforded to employees of the State of New Mexico as a result of this Participating Addendum. The Contractor acknowledges that all sums received hereunder are reportable by the Contractor for tax purposes, including without limitation, self-employment, and business income tax. The Contractor agrees not to purport to bind the State of New Mexico unless the Contractor has express written authority to do so, and then only within the strict limits of that authority.

11. Conflict of Interest; Governmental Conduct Act:

- A. The Contractor represents and warrants that it presently has no interest and, during the term of this Participating Addendum, shall not acquire any interest, direct or indirect, which would conflict in any manner or degree with the performance or services required under the Participating Addendum.
- B. The Contractor further represents and warrants that it has complied with, and, during the term of this Participating Addendum, will continue to comply with, and that this

Contractor shall provide immediate written notice to the Participating Entity if, at any time during the term of this Participating Addendum, Contractor learns that Contractor's representations and warranties in paragraphs A and B of this Clause were erroneous on the effective date of this Participating Addendum or have become erroneous by reason of new or changed circumstances. If it is later determined that Contractor's representations and warranties in paragraphs A and B of this Clause were erroneous on the effective date of this Participating Addendum or have become erroneous by reason of new or changed circumstances, in addition to other remedies available to the Participating Entity and notwithstanding anything in the Participating Addendum to the contrary, the Participating Entity may immediately terminate this Participating Addendum.
- D. All terms defined in the Governmental Conduct Act have the same meaning in this Participating Addendum.

12. Amendment:

- A. This Participating Addendum shall not be altered, changed, or amended except by instrument in writing executed by the parties hereto and all other required signatories.
- B. If the Participating Entity proposes an amendment to the Participating Addendum to unilaterally reduce funding due to budget or other considerations, the Contractor shall, within thirty (30) days of receipt of the proposed amendment, have the option to terminate this Participating Addendum, pursuant to the termination provisions as set forth in the Terminations Clause of this Participating Addendum or the Master Agreement, or to agree to the reduced funding.

13. Merger:

This Participating Addendum incorporates all the agreements, covenants, and understandings between the parties hereto concerning the subject matter hereof, and all such covenants, agreements and understandings have been merged into this written Participating Addendum. No prior agreement or understanding, oral or otherwise, of the parties or their agents shall be valid or enforceable unless embodied in this Participating Addendum.

14. Penalties for violation of law:

The Procurement Code, NMSA 1978 §§ 13-1-28 through 13-1-199, imposes civil and criminal penalties for violation of the statute. In addition, the New Mexico criminal statutes impose felony penalties for illegal acts, including bribes, gratuities, and kickbacks.

15. Equal Opportunity Compliance:

The Contractor agrees to abide by all federal and state laws and rules and regulations, and executive orders of the Governor of the State of New Mexico, pertaining to equal employment opportunity. 18. Invalid Term or Condition:

If any term or condition of this Participating Addendum shall be held invalid or unenforceable, the remainder of this Participating Addendum shall not be affected and shall be valid and enforceable.

19. Enforcement of Participating Addendum:

A party's failure to require strict performance of any provision of this Participating Addendum shall not waive or diminish that party's right thereafter to demand strict compliance with that or any other provision. No waiver by a party of any of its rights under this Participating Addendum shall be effective unless express and in writing, and no effective waiver by a party of any of its rights shall be effective to waive any other rights.

20. Non-Collusion:

In signing this Participating Addendum, the Contractor certifies the Contractor has not, either directly or indirectly, entered into action in restraint of free competitive bidding in connection with this offer submitted to the State Purchasing Agent or agency or entity.

21. Notices:

Any and all headings herein are inserted only for convenience and ease of reference and are not to be considered in the construction or interpretation of any provision of this Participating Addendum. Numbered or lettered provisions, sections, and subsections contained herein, refer only to provisions, sections, and subsections of this Participating Addendum unless otherwise expressly stated.

24. New Mexico Employees Health Coverage:

- A. If Contractor has, or grows to, six (6) or more employees who work, or who are expected to work, an average of at least 20 hours per week over a six (6) month period during the term of this Participating Addendum, Contractor certifies, by signing this Participating Addendum, to have in place, and agree to maintain for the term of the Participating Addendum health insurance for those employees and offer that health insurance to those employees if the expected annual value in the aggregate of any and all contracts between Contractor and the State exceed \$250,000 dollars.
- B. Contractor agrees to maintain a record of the number of employees who have (a) accepted health insurance; (b) declined health insurance due to other health insurance coverage already in place; or (c) declined health insurance for other reasons. These records are subject to review and audit by a representative of the state.

25. Indemnification:

The Contractor shall defend, indemnify and hold harmless the Procuring Agency and the State of New Mexico from all actions, proceeding, claims, demands, costs, damages, attorneys' fees and all other liabilities and expenses of any kind from any source which may arise out of the performance of this Participating Addendum, caused by the negligent act or failure to act

The Contractor shall not be liable for damages if failure to perform the order arises out of causes beyond the control and without the fault or negligence of the Contractor; such causes include, but are not restricted to, acts of God or the public enemy, acts of the State or Federal Government, fires, floods, epidemics, quarantine restrictions, strikes, freight embargoes, unusually severe weather and defaults of subcontractors due to any of the above.

27. Assignment and Subcontracting:

Contractor, without obtaining written consent from Participating Entity, may subcontract duties under this Participating Addendum to those subcontractors who are generally involved in the day-to-day business operations of Contractor, including, but not limited to, third-party logistics vendors, delivery carriers, and customer service providers. Neither party may assign this Participating Addendum without the prior written consent of the other party, except that Contractor may assign this Participating Addendum (i) to any of its subsidiaries or affiliates at any time, or (ii) in connection with the transfer or sale of all or substantially all of its business related to this Participating Addendum.

28. Commercial Warranty:

Products sold to Procuring Agency are new and of most current production. Contractor's warranties will be limited to Contractor-branded products. For all other products, Contractor will pass through to Procuring Agency all manufacturer-supplied end-user warranties on all products sourced to Procuring Agency.

29. Confidentiality:

Any Confidential Information provided to the Contractor by the Procuring Agency in the performance of this Participating Addendum shall be kept confidential and shall not be made available to any individual or organization by the Contractor without the prior written approval of the Procuring Agency. Upon termination of this Participating Addendum, Contractor shall deliver all Confidential Information in its possession to the Procuring Agency within thirty (30) Business Days of such termination.

If this Participating Addendum has been procured pursuant to a request for proposals, this Participating Addendum is derived from (1) the request for proposal, (including any written clarifications to the request for proposals and any agency response to questions); (2) the Contractor's best and final offer; and (3) the Contractor's response to the request for proposals.

In the event of a dispute under this Participating Addendum, applicable documents will be referred to for the purpose of clarification or for additional detail in the following order of precedence: (1) amendments to this Participating Addendum in reverse chronological order; (2) the Participating Addendum, including the scope of work and all terms and conditions thereof; (3) the Master Agreement; (4) the Contractor's best and final offer if such has been made; (5) the Contractor's response to the request for proposals; and (6) the request for proposals, including attachments thereto and written responses to questions and written clarifications.

32. Insurance:

If the services contemplated under this Participating Addendum will be performed on or in State facilities or property, Contractor shall maintain in force during the entire term of this Participating Addendum, the following insurance coverage(s), naming the State of New Mexico, General Services Department or other party to this Participating Addendum as additional insured.

- A. Workers Compensation (including accident and disease coverage) at the statutory limit.
 - 1. Employer's liability: \$100,000.
- B. Comprehensive general liability (including endorsements providing broad form property damage, personal injury coverage and contractual assumption of liability for all liability the Contractor has assumed under this Participating Addendum). Limits shall not be less than the following:
 - 1. Bodily injury: \$1,000,000 per person /\$1,000,000 per occurrence.
 - Property damage or combined single limit coverage: \$1,000,000.
 - 3. Automobile liability (including non-owned automobile coverage): \$1,000,000.
 - 4. Umbrella: \$1,000,000.
- C. Contractor shall maintain the above insurance for the term of this Participating Addendum and name the State of New Mexico, General Services Department or other party to this Participating Addendum as an additional insured and provide for 30 days cancellation notice on any Certificate of Insurance form furnished by Contractor. Such certificate shall also specifically state the coverage provided under the policy is primary over any other valid and collectible insurance and provide a waiver of subrogation.

ELECTRONIC RECORD AND SIGNATURE DISCLOSURE

A. ELECTRONIC RECORD AND SIGNATURE DISCLOSURE (ERSD)

From time to time, New Mexico General Services Department (GSD), on behalf of the State of New Mexico (SONM), may be required by law to provide you with certain written notices or disclosures. Stated below are the terms and conditions for GSD's providing you such notices and disclosures electronically through the DocuSign system. Please read this information carefully. If you are able to access this information electronically and agree to **this Electronic Record and Signature Disclosure (ERSD)**, please confirm your agreement by selecting the check-box next to "I agree to use electronic records and signatures" before clicking "CONTINUE" within the DocuSign system.

B. Obtaining paper copies

At any time up to twenty (20) calendar days following your use of DocuSign to electronically sign a document, you may request a paper copy of any record provided or made available electronically to you by GSD. You will have the ability to download and print documents SONM sends you through the DocuSign system during and immediately after the signing session and, if you elect to create a DocuSign account, you may access the documents for a twenty (20) calendar day period after such documents are first sent to you. Following the twenty (20) day period, if you want GSD to send you paper copies of any such documents from GSD's office, you will be charged a \$1.00 per-page fee plus postage. You may request delivery of such paper copies from GSD by following the procedure stated in Section H, below.

C. Withdrawing your consent

If you decide to receive notices and disclosures from GSD electronically, you may at any time change your mind and inform GSD you want to receive required notices and disclosures only in paper format. The procedure concerning how you may inform GSD of your decision to receive future notices and disclosures in paper format as well as withdraw your consent to receive notices and disclosures electronically is stated in Section D, immediately below.

D. Consequences of changing your mind

If you elect to receive required notices and disclosures only in paper format, it will slow the speed with which GSD will be able to complete certain steps in specific transactions and deliver paper copies to you. GSD will need: (1) to send the required notices or disclosures to you in paper format; and (2) wait until GSD receives your acknowledgment of your receipt of such paper notices or disclosures. Further, you will no longer be able to use the DocuSign system to receive required notices and consents electronically from SONM or to electronically sign documents generated and sent to you from SONM.

E. All notices and disclosures will be sent to you electronically

Unless you inform GSD otherwise according to these procedures, GSD will electronically provide you through the DocuSign system all required notices, disclosures, authorizations, acknowledgements and other documents that are required to be provided or made available to you during the course of your electronic signature relationship with SONM. To reduce the possibility of inadvertent non-receipt, GSD prefers to provide all required notices and disclosures by the same method and to the same email or physical address that you furnish to GSD. Thus, you may receive the disclosures and notices electronically or in paper form. If you do not agree with this procedure, please inform GSD according to the procedures stated in Section I, below. Please also refer to Section D, immediately above, which states the consequences resulting from your declination of electronic delivery of notices and disclosures.

F. How to contact GSD:

You may inform General Services Department (GSD) of any changes you select regarding State Purchasing Division's (SPD) electronic communications with you, to request paper copies of certain information from SPD, and to withdraw your prior consent to receive notices and disclosures electronically by emailing your request(s) to SPD at: <u>GSD.SPDinfo@state.nm.us</u>

G. To advise SPD of your new email address

To inform SPD of a change in the email address to which SPD sends you notices and disclosures electronically, you must send an email to SPD at <u>GSD.SPDinfo@state.nm.us</u> and in the body of such request you must include your previous and new email addresses.

H. To request paper copies from SPD

To request delivery of paper copies of electronic notices and disclosures that DocuSign and/or SPD have previously provided to you, you must send an email to SPD at GSD.SPDinfo@state.nm.us and in the body of your email request state your email address, full name, mailing address, and telephone number. SPD will charge you a \$1.00 per page copy fee plus postage.

I. To withdraw your consent with SPD

To inform SPD that you no longer wish to receive notices and disclosures in electronic format you may:

- (1) Decline to sign a document from within a signing session, and on the subsequent page, select the check-box indicating you wish to withdraw your consent, or you may:
- (2) Send SPD an email to <u>GSD.SPDinfo@state.nm.us</u> and in the body of your request state your email address, full name, mailing address, and telephone number.

J. Required hardware and software
