ELECTRONIC RECORD AND SIGNATURE DISCLOSURE

A. ELECTRONIC RECORD AND SIGNATURE DISCLOSURE (ERSD)

From time to time, New Mexico General Services Department (GSD), on behalf of the State of New Mexico (SONM), may be required by law to provide you with certain written notices or disclosures. Stated below are the terms and conditions for GSD's providing you such notices and disclosures electronically through the DocuSign system. Please read this information carefully. If you are able to access this information electronically and agree to **this Electronic Record and Signature Disclosure (ERSD)**, please confirm your agreement by selecting the check-box next to "I agree to use electronic records and signatures" before clicking "CONTINUE" within the DocuSign system.

B. Obtaining paper copies

At any time up to twenty (20) calendar days following your use of DocuSign to electronically sign a document, you may request a paper copy of any record provided or made available electronically to you by GSD. You will have the ability to download and print documents SONM sends you through the DocuSign system during and immediately after the signing session and, if you elect to create a DocuSign account, you may access the documents for a twenty (20) calendar day period after such documents are first sent to you. Following the twenty (20) day period, if you want GSD to send you paper copies of any such documents from GSD's office, you will be charged a \$1.00 per-page fee plus postage. This Participating Addendum is entered into by the State of New Mexico and JAGGAER LLC (formerly SciQuest, Inc.) ("Contractor," and together with the Participating Entity, the "Addendum Parties"), pursuant to that certain Master Price Agreement for eProcurement Services (Hosted Software-as-a-Service), dated June 30, 2011, by and among Contractor and the State of Colorado, Administered by the State of Utah, and the NASPO ValuePoint Agreement #W33-2010/PA494, and State of New Mexico Price Agreement #20-00000-22-00050 (together with its exhibits and attachments, the "Master Agreement"). The underlying procurement for these Services was led by the State of Colorado, administered by the State of Utah on behalf of NASPO ValuePoint, for use by Participating Entities and those Authorized Purchasers approved by the Chief Procurement Official of a Participating Entity to utilize state contracts. This Participating Addendum is entered into pursuant to and incorporates by reference the terms and conditions of the Master Agreement. This Participating Addendum and the exhibits attached hereto are collectively referred to as the "Addendum."

In consideration of the premises, covenants and mutual promises contained in this Addendum, and for other valuable consideration, the receipt and sufficiency of which is hereby acknowledged, the Addendum Parties hereby agree as follows.

- 1. <u>Scope</u>: The scope of this Addendum shall be limited to the scope of the Master Agreement. The purpose of this Addendum is to create a statewide centralized electronic procurement system providing more efficient delivery of state procurement services through the use of technology.
- 2. <u>Participation</u>: Use of the Master Agreement by an Authorized Purchaser is subject to the approval of the State Chief Procurement Official of the Participating Entity. Issues of interpretation and eligibility for participation are solely within the authority of the Participating Entity's Chief Procurement Official.
- 3. <u>Modifications to Master Agreement</u>: Modifications to the Master Agreement and additional terms and conditions specific to this Addendum are attached hereto and incorporated herein as **Attachment A**.

authority. PLEASE NOTE NO PROPERTY TAX WILL BE PAID TO THE CONTRACTOR
BY THE PARTICIPATING STATE. The payment of taxes for any money received under this
Agreement shall be the Contractor's sole responsibility and should be reported under the Contractor's
Federal and State tax identification number(s).

Contractor and any and all subcontractors shall pay all Federal, state and local taxes applicable to its operation and any persons employed by the Contractor. Contractor shall require all subcontractors to hold the Participating State harmless from any responsibility for taxes, damages and interest, if applicable, contributions required under Federal and/or state and local laws and regulations and any other costs, including transaction privilege taxes, unemployment compensation insurance, Social Security and Worker's Compensation.

2. Definitions:

- a. "Authorized Users" shall mean (i) the Participating State's employees, contractors, subcontractors and outsourcing vendors and (ii) employees, contractors, subcontractors and outsourcing vendors of any Affiliates or other entities designated in an Order Form as being authorized by the Participating State to access and use the JAGGAER Applications and Services, in each case who have been supplied user identification and passwords by the Participating State. Any use by contractors, subcontractors or outsourcing vendors acting on the Participating State's behalf shall be subject to the terms of this Agreement and the Participating State remains responsible for its obligations and for the activities and omissions of such third parties.
- b. "Client Data" shall mean data generated, uploaded or transmitted by Authorized Users using the JAGGAER Applications.
- c. "JAGGAER Applications" shall mean those software applications made available to the Participating State by the Contractor via a Subscription.
- d. "Order Form" shall mean the ordering documents executed by the Contractor and the Participating State that represent the initial purchase of the Subscription to the JAGGAER Applications and certain Services, and any subsequent ordering documents that from time to time are executed hereunder by the Participating State and the Contractor and which shall expressly refer to the Agreement.
- e. "**Professional Services**" shall mean any implementation, training, consulting, data migration, conversion, integration or other services provided by the Contractor to the Participating State, as set forth in a statement of work or as described in the Terms of Service.
- f. "Services" shall mean the Support Services and Professional Services.
- g. "Subscription" shall mean the right of Authorized Users to access the JAGGAER Applications and certain Professional Services during the Subscription Term, as set forth in an Order Form.
- h. "Support Services" shall mean the maintenance and support services described in the Terms of Service and provided in connection with the JAGGAER Applications.
- i. "Terms of Service" shall mean those Support Services and Professional Services terms posted at https://www.jaggaer.com/jaggaer-one-terms-of-service/, which are incorporated herein. The Participating State acknowledges and agrees it has read, understands and agrees to be bound by the Terms of Service.

- 3. Changes: In connection with the Contractor's efforts to continually improve the JAGGAER Applications and Services, the Contractor may from time to time develop and make available to the Contractor's clients, free of charge, enhancements, upgrades, updates, improvements, modifications, extensions and other changes to the JAGGAER Applications, Services and Terms of Service ("Changes"). The Contractor shall provide the Participating State reasonable, advance notice of all Changes to the JAGGAER Applications, Services and Terms of Service in order to, among other things, enable the Participating State to prepare for upcoming releases, learn about new features, and access key information about the JAGGAER Applications, Services and Terms of Service. IN NO EVENT MAY THE CONTRACTOR MAKE ANY CHANGES THAT MATERIALLY AND ADVERSELY IMPACT THE PARTICIPATING STATE'S USE OF THE JAGGAER APPLICATIONS OR SERVICES. The Participating State hereby authorizes JAGGAER to implement such Changes.
- 4. <u>Term:</u> THIS AGREEMENT SHALL NOT BECOME EFFECTIVE UNTIL APPROVED IN WRITING BY THE NEW MEXICO STATE PURCHASING AGENT, IF REQUIRED. This Agreement shall begin on a date approved by the New Mexico State Purchasing Agent, if the New Mexico State Purchasing Agent has signed this Agreement, and end on July 31, 2023. The Participating State reserves the right to renew the contract on an annual basis by mutual Agreement not to exceed a total of 10 years in accordance with NMSA 1978 §13-1-150.

5. Termination:

- a) Grounds. The Participating State may terminate this Agreement for cause. The Contractor may only terminate this Agreement based upon the Participating State's uncured, material breach of this Agreement.
- b) Notice; Participating State Opportunity to Cure.
 - (1) Except as otherwise provided in sub-paragraph A of this Clause and the Appropriations Clause of this Agreement, the Participating State shall give Contractor written notice of termination at least thirty (30) days prior to the intended date of termination.
 - (2) Contractor shall give Participating State written notice of termination at least thirty (30) days prior to the intended date of termination, which notice shall (i) identify all the Participating State's material breaches of this Agreement upon which the termination is based and (ii) state what the Participating State must do to cure such material breaches. Contractor's notice of termination shall only be effective (i) if the Participating State does not cure all material breaches within the thirty (30) day notice period or (ii) in the case of material breaches that cannot be cured within thirty (30) days, the Participating State does not, within the thirty (30) day notice period, notify the Contractor of its intent to cure and begin with due diligence to cure the material breach.
 - (3) Notwithstanding the foregoing, this Agreement may be terminated upon thirty (30) days written notice to the Contractor (i) if the Contractor becomes unable to provide the Goods or perform the Services contracted for; (ii) if, during the term of this Agreement, the Contractor is suspended or debarred by the New Mexico State Purchasing Agent; or (iii) the Agreement is terminated pursuant to the Appropriations Clause of this Agreement.
- c) Liability. Except as otherwise expressly allowed or provided under this Agreement, the Participating State's sole liability upon termination shall be to pay for acceptable work performed prior to termination of this Agreement; provided, however, that a notice of termination shall not nullify or otherwise affect either Party's liability for pre-termination defaults under or breaches of this Agreement. The Contractor shall submit an invoice for such work within thirty (30) days of

receiving or sending the notice of termination. THIS PROVISION IS NOT EXCLUSIVE AND DOES NOT WAIVE THE PARTICIPATING STATE'S OTHER LEGAL RIGHTS AND REMEDIES CAUSED BY THE CONTRACTOR'S DEFAULT/BREACH OF THIS AGREEMENT.

- 6. Appropriations: The terms of this Agreement are contingent upon sufficient appropriations and authorization being made by the Legislature of New Mexico for the performance of this Agreement. If sufficient appropriations and authorization are not made by the Legislature for the performance of this Agreement and, specifically, payment to the Contractor, or if any specific product of the Contractor applicable to the Participating State is no longer available, this Agreement shall terminate upon thirty (30) days written notice being given by the Participating State to the Contractor. The Participating State's decision as to whether sufficient appropriations are available shall be accepted by the Contractor and shall be final.
- 7. Status of Contractor: The Contractor and its agents and employees are independent contractors providing Goods and/or performing professional or general services for the Participating State and are not employees of the State of New Mexico. The Contractor and its agents and employees shall not accrue leave, retirement, insurance, bonding, use of state vehicles, or any other benefits afforded to employees of the State of New Mexico as a result of this Agreement. The Contractor acknowledges that all sums received hereunder are reportable by the Contractor for tax purposes, including without limitation, self-employment and business income tax. The Contractor agrees not to purport to bind the State of New Mexico unless the Contractor has express written authority to do so, and then only within the strict limits of that authority.

8. Conflict of Interest; Governmental Conduct Act:

- a) The Contractor represents and warrants that it presently has no interest and, during the term of this Agreement, shall not acquire any interest, direct or indirect, which would conflict in any manner or degree with the performance or services required under the Agreement.
- b) The Contractor further represents and warrants that it has complied with, and, during the term of this Agreement, will continue to comply with, and that this Agreement complies with all applicable provisions of the Governmental Conduct Act, Chapter 10, Article 16 NMSA 1978. Without in any way limiting the generality of the foregoing, the Contractor specifically represents and warrants that:
 - (1) in accordance with NMSA 1978, § 10-16-4.3, the Contractor does not employ, has not employed, and will not employ during the term of this Agreement any Participating State employee while such employee was or is employed by the Participating State and participating directly or indirectly in the Participating State's contracting process;
 - (2) this Agreement complies with NMSA 1978, § 10-16-7(A) because (i) the Contractor is not a public officer or employee of the Participating State; (ii) the Contractor is not a member of the family of a public officer or employee of the Participating State; (iii) the Contractor is not a business in which a public officer or employee or the family of a public officer or employee has a substantial interest; or (iv) if the Contractor is a public officer or employee of the Participating State, a member of the family of a public officer or employee of the Participating State, or a business in which a public officer or employee of the Participating State or the family of a public officer or employee of the Participating State has a substantial interest, public notice was given as required by NMSA 1978, § 10-16-7(A) and this Agreement was awarded pursuant to a competitive process;

- (3) in accordance with NMSA 1978, § 10-16-8(A), (i) the Contractor is not, and has not been represented by, a person who has been a public officer or employee of the Participating State within the preceding year and whose official act directly resulted in this Agreement and (ii) the Contractor is not, and has not been assisted in any way regarding this transaction by, a former public officer or employee of the Participating State whose official act, while in the Participating State's employment, directly resulted in the Participating State's making this Agreement;
- (4) this Agreement complies with NMSA 1978, § 10-16-9(A)because (i) the Contractor is not a legislator; (ii) the Contractor is not a member of a legislator's family; (iii) the Contractor is not a business in which a legislator or a legislator's family has a substantial interest; or (iv) if the Contractor is a legislator, a member of a legislator's family, or a business in which a legislator or a legislator's family has a substantial interest, disclosure has been made as required by NMSA 1978, § 10-16-7(A), this Agreement is not a sole source or small purchase contract, and this Agreement was awarded in accordance with the provisions of the Procurement Code:
- (5) in accordance with NMSA 1978, § 10-16-13, the Contractor has not directly participated in the preparation of specifications, qualifications or evaluation criteria for this Agreement or any procurement related to this Agreement; and
- (6) in accordance with NMSA 1978, § 10-16-3 and § 10-16-13.3, the Contractor has not contributed, and during the term of this Agreement shall not contribute, anything of value to a public officer or employee of the Participating State.
- c) Contractor's representations and warranties in paragraphs A and B of this Clause are material representations of fact upon which the Participating State relied when this Agreement was entered into by the Parties. Contractor shall provide immediate written notice to the Participating State if, at any time during the term of this Agreement, Contractor learns that Contractor's representations and warranties in paragraphs A and B of this Clause were erroneous on the effective date of this Agreement or have become erroneous by reason of new or changed circumstances. If it is later determined that Contractor's representations and warranties in paragraphs A and B of this Clause were erroneous on the effective date of this Agreement or have become erroneous by reason of new or changed circumstances, in addition to other remedies available to the Participating State and notwithstanding anything in the Agreement to the contrary, the Participating State may immediately terminate the Agreement.
- d) All terms defined in the Governmental Conduct Act have the same meaning in this Agreement.

9. Amendment:

- a) This Agreement shall not be altered, changed or amended except by instrument in writing executed by the Parties hereto and all other required signatories.
- b) If the Participating State proposes an amendment to the Agreement to unilaterally reduce funding due to budget or other considerations, the Contractor shall, within thirty (30) days of receipt of the proposed Amendment, have the option to terminate the Agreement, pursuant to the termination provisions as set forth in the Terminations Clause of this Agreement, or to agree to the reduced funding.
- 10. <u>Merger:</u> This Agreement incorporates all the Agreements, covenants and understandings between the Parties hereto concerning the subject matter hereof, and all such covenants, Agreements and understandings have been merged into this written Agreement. No prior Agreement or

- understanding, oral or otherwise, of the Parties or their agents shall be valid or enforceable unless embodied in this Agreement.
- 11. <u>Penalties for violation of law:</u> The Procurement Code, NMSA 1978 §§ 13-1-28 through 13-1-199, imposes civil and criminal penalties for violation of the statute. In addition, the New Mexico criminal statutes impose felony penalties for illegal acts, including bribes, gratuities and kickbacks.
- 12. Equal Opportunity Compliance: The Contractor agrees to abide by all federal and state laws and rules and regulations, and executive orders of the Governor of the State of New Mexico, pertaining to equal employment opportunity. In accordance with all such laws of the State of New Mexico, the Contractor assures that no person in the United States shall, on the grounds of race, religion, color, national origin, ancestry, sex, age, physical or mental handicap, or serious medical condition, spousal affiliation, sexual orientation or gender identity, be excluded from employment with or participation in, be denied the benefits of, or be otherwise subjected to discrimination under any program or activity performed under this Agreement. If Contractor is found not to be in compliance with these requirements during the life of this Agreement, Contractor agrees to take appropriate steps to correct these deficiencies.
- 13. <u>Workers Compensation:</u> The Contractor agrees to comply with the Participating State's laws and rules applicable to workers compensation benefits for its employees. If the Contractor fails to comply with the Workers Compensation Act and applicable rules when required to do so, this Agreement may be terminated by the Participating State.
- 14. <u>Applicable Law:</u> The laws of the State of New Mexico shall govern this Agreement, without giving effect to its choice of law provisions. Venue shall be proper only in a New Mexico court of competent jurisdiction in accordance with NMSA 1978, § 38-3-1 (G). By execution of this Agreement, Contractor acknowledges and agrees to the jurisdiction of the courts of the State of New Mexico over any and all lawsuits arising under or out of any term of this Agreement.
- 15. Records and Financial Audit: The Contractor shall maintain detailed time and expenditure records that indicate the date, time, nature and cost of services rendered during the Agreement's term and effect and retain them for a period of three (3) years from the date of final payment under this Agreement. The records shall be subject to inspection by the Participating State, including the New Mexico Department of Finance and Administration and the New Mexico State Auditor. The Participating State shall have the right to audit billings both before and after payment.
- **16.** <u>Invalid Term or Condition:</u> If any term or condition of this Agreement shall be held invalid or unenforceable, the remainder of this Agreement shall not be affected and shall be valid and enforceable.
- 17. Enforcement of Agreement: A Party's failure to require strict performance of any provision of this Agreement shall not waive or diminish that Party's right thereafter to demand strict compliance with that or any other provision. No waiver by a Party of any of its rights under this Agreement shall be effective unless express and in writing, and no effective waiver by a Party of any of its rights shall be effective to waive any other rights.
- **18.** <u>Non-Collusion:</u> In signing this Agreement, the Contractor certifies the Contractor has not, either directly or indirectly, entered into action in restraint of free competitive bidding in connection with this offer submitted to the Participating State.

19. <u>Notices:</u> Any notice required to be given to either Party by this Agreement shall be in writing and shall be delivered in person, by courier service or by U.S. mail, either first class or certified, return receipt requested, postage prepaid, as follows:

20. Succession: This Agreement shall extend to and be binding upon the successors and assigns of the Parties.

21. Use of the JAGGAER Applications and Services:

- a. Proprietary Rights. This is a subscription agreement for use of the JAGGAER Applications. This Agreement is not a sale, assignment or transfer, of any software. The Participating State agrees that the Contractor, its licensors or its suppliers retain all right, title and interest (including all patent, copyright, trade secret and other intellectual property rights) in and to the JAGGAER Applications, the Services, Services deliverables and any and all related and underlying software (including interfaces created by the Contractor), databases, technology, reports and documentation, and any adaptation, modification, derivation, addition or extension to the JAGGAER Applications and Services. Except for the Subscription granted hereunder, nothing in the Agreement gives the Participating State any right, title or interest in or to the JAGGAER Applications, the Services or any related documentation.
- **b. JAGGAER License.** JAGGAER hereby grants to the Participating State a nontransferable, non-exclusive license during the Subscription Term, to allow Authorized Users to access and use the JAGGAER Applications for its internal business purposes.
- c. Use Guidelines.
 - i. The JAGGAER Applications are provided to the Participating State for use only as expressly set forth in this Agreement, and the Participating State will not use the JAGGAER Applications in whole or in part for any other use or purpose. In particular, the Participating State will not, and will not allow any third party to:

 (i) decompile, disassemble, reverse engineer or attempt to reconstruct, identify or discover any source code, underlying ideas, underlying user interface techniques or algorithms of the JAGGAER Applications by any means, or disclose any of the foregoing; (ii) except as expressly set forth in this Agreement, provide, rent, lease, lend, or use the JAGGAER Applications for timesharing, subscription, or service bureau purposes; (iii) sublicense, transfer or assign the JAGGAER Applications or any of the rights or licenses granted under this Agreement; or remove or obscure any trademark, product identification, proprietary marking,

- copyright or other notices provided with the JAGGAER Applications or related documentation.
- ii. The Participating State shall not: (i) use the JAGGAER Applications for storage, possession, or transmission of any information, the possession, creation or transmission of which violates any state, local or federal law; (ii) transmit Client Data using the JAGGAER Applications that infringes upon or misappropriates the intellectual property or privacy rights of any third party; (iii) perform any load testing of the JAGGAER Applications or attempt to probe, scan or test the vulnerability of the JAGGAER Applications without the Contractor's prior, written consent; or (iv) log into a server or account that the Participating State is not authorized to access.
- d. Client Responsibilities. The Participating State is responsible for all activity occurring under Authorized User accounts and for each Authorized User's compliance with all terms and conditions of this Agreement. The Participating State shall have sole responsibility for the accuracy, quality, integrity, legality, reliability and appropriateness of all Client Data generated, uploaded and transmitted by the Participating State and Authorized Users. The Participating State shall use commercially reasonable efforts to prevent unauthorized access to, or use of, the JAGGAER Applications and notify the Contractor immediately of any unauthorized use of any password or account or any other known or suspected breach of security.
- e. Authorized Users.
 - i. The Subscription to the JAGGAER Applications is granted solely to Authorized Users and shall not be shared with any third parties, except as set forth in Section 2(a) above. If a maximum number of Authorized Users is specified in the Order Form, the number of Authorized Users accessing the JAGGAER Applications shall not exceed such maximum number. User Subscriptions are for named users and cannot be shared or used by more than one user but may be reassigned from time to time when Authorized Users have terminated an employment or some other prior relationship with the Participating State, changed job status or function, or otherwise no longer require ongoing use of the JAGGAER Applications.
 - ii. The Participating State acknowledges that the price of the Subscription purchased hereunder is based on the Participating State's access requirements as provided to the Contractor as of the effective date of this Agreement. In the event the Participating State wishes to subsequently expand access to additional users, Affiliates, business units or otherwise, the Participating State may purchase additional Subscriptions to the JAGGAER Applications by executing separate Order Forms hereunder.
- f. Participating State's Ownership of all Client Data. The Participating State owns all right, title and interest in, and to, all Client Data. Client Data is deemed Confidential Information under this Agreement. In connection with the Participating State's use of the JAGGAER Applications, the Contractor is provided access to Client Data. The Participating State grants to the Contractor a limited license to use the Client Data only to the extent set forth in this Agreement.
- g. Security and Privacy of Client Data. The Contractor understands the sensitive nature of the Client Data and other Confidential Information provided by the Participating State. The Contractor shall maintain the confidentiality of Client Data in accordance with its confidentiality obligations under this Agreement. Additionally, the Contractor shall maintain, at a minimum, industry standard administrative, physical and technical safeguards for protection of the security, confidentiality and integrity of Client Data. Lastly, the Contractor adheres to, and is audited by independent third-party auditors for

compliance with, industry data handling standards (such as Service Organization Control ("SOC") standards) or equivalent standards. The Contractor shall not use or disclose Client Data except as needed to facilitate the Participating State's use of the JAGGAER Applications and Services, or otherwise to perform or provide services under this Agreement, as further described in the https://www.jaggaer.com/service-privacy-policy/, which is incorporated into this Agreement.

22. <u>Headings:</u> Any and all headings herein are inserted only for convenience and ease of reference and are not to be considered in the construction or interpretation of any provision of this Agreement. Numbered or lettered provisions, sections and subsections contained herein, refer only to provisions, sections and subsections of this Agreement unless otherwise expressly stated.

23. Payment:

- a. Payment. Unless otherwise stated in the applicable Order Form, all payments shall be made in United States dollars no later than thirty (30) days after the date of invoice, payable in full, without reduction for any offset, withholding or other claims (except with respect to charges then under reasonable and good faith dispute as evidenced in a writing promptly sent by the Participating State to the Contractor prior to the payment due date). All payments not received when due shall accrue interest at a rate per month of one and one-half percent (1.5%) (excluding reasonably disputed payments).
- b. Suspension of Service. IF THE PARTICIPATING STATE ACCOUNT IS THIRTY (30) DAYS OR MORE OVERDUE (EXCEPT WITH RESPECT TO CHARGES THEN UNDER REASONABLE AND GOOD FAITH DISPUTE), IN ADDITION TO ANY OTHER RIGHTS AND REMEDIES (INCLUDING THE TERMINATION RIGHTS SET FORTH IN THIS AGREEMENT), THE CONTRACTOR RESERVES THE RIGHT, UPON TEN (10) DAYS PRIOR WRITTEN NOTICE TO THE PARTICIPATING STATE, TO SUSPEND THE SUBSCRIPTION TO THE JAGGAER APPLICATIONS AND PROVISION OF SERVICES WITHOUT LIABILITY TO THE CONTRACTOR UNTIL SUCH ACCOUNT IS PAID IN FULL.
- **24.** <u>Default/Breach:</u> In case of Default and/or Breach by the Contractor, for any reason whatsoever, the Purchasing Entity and the State of New Mexico may procure the Goods or Services from another source and hold the Contractor responsible for any resulting excess costs and/or damages, and the Purchasing Entity and the State of New Mexico may also seek all other remedies under the terms of this Agreement and under law or equity.
- 25. Equitable Remedies: Contractor acknowledges that its failure to comply with any provision of this Agreement will cause the Participating State irrevocable harm and that a remedy at law for such a failure would be an inadequate remedy for the Participating State, and the Contractor consents to the Participating State's obtaining from a court of competent jurisdiction, specific performance, or injunction, or any other equitable relief in order to enforce such compliance. Participating State's rights to obtain equitable relief pursuant to this Agreement shall be in addition to, and not in lieu of, any other remedy that the Participating State may have under applicable law, including, but not limited to, monetary damages.

26. New Mexico Employees Health Coverage:

a) If Contractor has, or grows to, six (6) or more employees who work, or who are expected to work, an average of at least 20 hours per week over a six (6) month period during the term of this Agreement, Contractor certifies, by signing this agreement, to have in place, and agree to

- maintain for the term of the Agreement, health insurance for those employees and offer that health insurance to those employees if the expected annual value in the aggregate of any and all contracts between Contractor and the Participating State exceed \$250,000.
- b) Contractor agrees to maintain a record of the number of employees who have (a) accepted health insurance; (b) declined health insurance due to other health insurance coverage already in place; or (c) declined health insurance for other reasons. These records are subject to review and audit by a representative of the Participating State.
- c) Contractor agrees to advise all employees of the availability of Participating State's publicly financed health care coverage programs by providing each employee with, as a minimum, the following web site link to additional information: https://bewellnm.com/.
- 27. Indemnification: The Contractor shall defend, indemnify and hold harmless the Participating State from and against any and all claims, suits, proceedings, losses, damages, liabilities, costs and expenses (including, without limitation, reasonable attorneys' fees) arising out of any claims, demands, suits or proceedings brought by a third party alleging that the JAGGAER Applications infringe upon any patent, copyright or trademark or misappropriate any trade secret or other intellectual property rights of any third party. The Contractor shall have no obligation to indemnify the Participating State to the extent any alleged patent infringement arises out of (a) the use of the JAGGAER Applications by the Participating State in combination with other data, products, software, processes or materials not provided or authorized by the Contractor; (b) the modification of the JAGGAER Applications by a party other than the Contractor; (c) any unauthorized use of the JAGGAER Applications or (d) the Client Data. Should the JAGGAER Applications as used by the Participating State infringe, or in the Contractor's commercially reasonable opinion be likely to infringe, the Contractor shall, at its option and sole expense: (i) procure for the Participating State the right to continue to use the JAGGAER Applications, (ii) modify the JAGGAER Applications to eliminate any such claim that might result from their use hereunder, provided such modification does not adversely affect the functional capabilities of the JAGGAER Applications or (iii) replace the JAGGAER Applications with equally suitable, compatible and functionally equivalent noninfringing JAGGAER Applications at no additional charge to the Participating State. If none of these options is commercially practicable, then this Agreement may be terminated by the Contractor without further obligation or liability on the part of either party hereto except that the Contractor agrees to promptly refund to the Participating State the fees paid by the Participating State for the portion of the Subscription Term for which the JAGGAER Applications would no longer be available to the Participating State. In the event that any action, suit or proceeding related to the services performed by the Contractor or any officer, agent, employee, servant or subcontractor under this Agreement is brought against the Contractor, the Contractor shall, as soon as practicable but no later than five (5) days after it receives notice thereof, notify the legal counsel of the Participating State and the Risk Management Division of the New Mexico General Services Department by certified mail.
- 28. Limitations of Liability: NEITHER PARTY, ITS AFFILIATES, DIRECTORS, OFFICERS, EMPLOYEES, AGENTS OR CONTRACTORS, SHALL BE LIABLE TO THE OTHER PARTY FOR ANY INDIRECT, INCIDENTAL, SPECIAL, CONSEQUENTIAL, PUNITIVE OR EXEMPLARY DAMAGES OR LIABILITY (INCLUDING REASONABLE ATTORNEYS' FEES) THAT RESULT FROM OR ARE RELATED TO THIS AGREEMENT OR ANY OF THE JAGGAER APPLICATIONS, WHETHER IN CONTRACT OR TORT OR UNDER ANY OTHER THEORY OF LIABILITY, EVEN IF THE OTHER PARTY HAS BEEN INFORMED OF THE POSSIBILITY OF SUCH DAMAGES OR LIABILITY. TO THE EXTENT PERMITTED UNDER NEW MEXICO LAW, EXCEPT FOR AMOUNTS OWED TO THE CONTRACTOR BY THE PARTICIPATING STATE AS SET FORTH IN AN ORDER FORM, THIS AGREEMENT OR ANOTHER DOCUMENT, THE AGGREGATE LIABILITY OF EITHER PARTY RELATED TO

OR ARISING OUT OF THE AGREEMENT OR ANY OF THE JAGGAER APPLICATIONS, WHETHER IN CONTRACT, TORT OR UNDER ANY OTHER THEORY OF LIABILITY, SHALL NOT EXCEED THE AMOUNTS RECEIVED BY THE CONTRACTOR FROM THE PARTICIPATING STATE IN THE TWELVE (12) MONTHS PRECEDING THE EVENT GIVING RISE TO SUCH DAMAGES. THE LIMITATIONS OF LIABILITY UNDER THIS SECTION SHALL NOT APPLY TO ANY OBLIGATIONS AND LIABILITIES ARISING FROM VIOLATIONS BY EITHER PARTY HEREUNDER OF SECTIONS 21 OR 35 OF THIS AGREEMENT, OR ANY INDEMNIFICATION PROVIDED BY THE CONTRACTOR UNDER SECTION 25 OF THIS AGREEMENT.

- 29. Default and Force Majeure: The Purchasing Entity reserves the right to cancel all or any part of any Orders placed under this Agreement without further cost to the Purchasing Entity, due to the Contractor's default. The Contractor shall not be liable for any excess costs if failure to perform the Order arises out of causes beyond the control and without the fault or negligence of the Contractor; such causes include, but are not restricted to, acts of God or the public enemy, acts of the State or Federal Government, fires, floods, epidemics, quarantine restrictions, strikes, freight embargoes, unusually severe weather and defaults of subcontractors due to any of the above, unless the Participating State shall determine that the supplies or services to be furnished by the subcontractor were obtainable from other sources in sufficient time to permit the Contractor to meet the required delivery scheduled. The rights and remedies of the Participating State provided in this Clause shall not be exclusive and are in addition to any other rights now being provided by law or under this Agreement.
- **30.** <u>Assignment:</u> The Contractor shall not assign or transfer any interest in this Agreement or assign any claims for money due or to become due under this Agreement without the prior written approval of the Participating State, such approval not to be unreasonably withheld.
- **31.** <u>Subcontracting:</u> The Contractor shall not subcontract any portion of the services to be performed under this Agreement without the prior written approval of the Participating State, such approval not to be unreasonably withheld. No such subcontract shall relieve the primary Contractor from its obligations and liabilities under this Agreement, nor shall any subcontract obligate direct payment from the Participating State.
- **32.** <u>Inspection of Plant:</u> The Participating State may inspect, at any reasonable time during Contractor's regular business hours and upon prior written notice, the Contractor's plant or place of business, or any subcontractor's plant or place of business, which is related to the performance of this Agreement.

33. Warranty:

a. JAGGAER Applications Warranty. The Contractor hereby warrants that the JAGGAER Applications will operate in substantial conformity with the then-current published specifications. In the event of any failure of the JAGGAER Applications to perform in substantial conformity to such specifications, the Contractor will, at the Contractor's sole option, and as the Participating State's sole and exclusive remedy, either (i) repair the applicable JAGGAER Applications or (ii) terminate this Agreement and/or the Subscription to the JAGGAER Applications and refund to the Participating State a sum equal to the Subscription fees paid for the period during which the JAGGAER Applications were rendered unusable, prorated on a monthly basis.

- **b. Services Warranty.** The Contractor represents and warrants that it will perform the Services in a good, workmanlike and professional manner. The Participating State's remedy for breach of the warranties in this paragraph shall be the re-performance of the relevant Services free of charge.
- c. Disclaimer of Warranties. EXCEPT FOR THE WARRANTIES CONTAINED IN THIS SECTION 33, THE CONTRACTOR MAKES NO WARRANTIES REGARDING THE JAGGAER APPLICATIONS AND SERVICES. THE CONTRACTOR SPECIFICALLY DISCLAIMS ANY AND ALL OTHER WARRANTIES, WHETHER EXPRESS OR IMPLIED, INCLUDING WITHOUT LIMITATION, ANY IMPLIED WARRANTIES OF MERCHANTABILITY, FITNESS FOR A PARTICULAR PURPOSE OR NONINFRINGEMENT. THE CONTRACTOR DOES NOT WARRANT THAT ACCESS TO THE JAGGAER APPLICATIONS WILL BE UNINTERRUPTED OR ERROR-FREE, THAT ALL DEFECTS AND ERRORS IN THE JAGGAER APPLICATIONS WILL BE CORRECTED. OR THAT THE JAGGAER APPLICATIONS AND SERVICES WILL MEET THE PARTICIPATING STATE'S PARTICULAR REQUIREMENTS OR EXPECTATIONS. THE CONTRACTOR DOES NOT PROVIDE ANY WARRANTIES REGARDING THE ACCURACY OF DATA OR INFORMATION PROVIDED BY THIRD PARTIES. THE CONTRACTOR SHALL NOT BE LIABLE OR RESPONSIBLE FOR ANY DELAYS, INTERRUPTIONS, SERVICE FAILURES AND ANY OTHER PROBLEMS ARISING FROM THE PARTICIPATING STATE'S USE OF THE INTERNET, ELECTRONIC COMMUNICATIONS OR ANY OTHER SYSTEMS. THE PROVISIONS OF THIS SECTION ALLOCATE THE RISKS UNDER THIS AGREEMENT BETWEEN THE CONTRACTOR AND THE PARTICIPATING STATE. THE CONTRACTOR'S PRICING REFLECTS THIS ALLOCATION OF RISK AND THE LIMITED WARRANTIES SPECIFIED HEREIN.
- **34.** Condition of Proposed Items: Where Goods are a part of this Agreement, all proposed items are to be NEW and of most current production, unless otherwise specified in the Participating Addendum.
- 35. Confidentiality: Any Confidential Information provided to the Contractor by the Participating State or, developed by the Contractor based on information provided by the Participating State in the performance of this Agreement shall be kept confidential and shall not be made available to any individual or organization by the Contractor without the prior written approval of the Participating State. Upon termination of this Agreement, Contractor shall deliver all Confidential Information in its possession to the Participating State within thirty (30) business days of such termination. Contractor acknowledges that failure to deliver such Confidential Information to the Participating State will result in damages.

36. Contractor Personnel:

a) Key Personnel. Contractor's key personnel shall not be diverted from this Agreement without the prior written approval of the Participating State. Key personnel are those individuals considered by the Participating State to be mandatory to the work to be performed under this Agreement. Key personnel shall be:

- b) Personnel Changes. Replacement of any personnel shall be made with personnel of equal ability, experience, and qualification and shall be approved by the Participating State. For all personnel, the Participating State reserves the right to require submission of their resumes prior to approval. If the number of Contractor's personnel assigned to the Agreement is reduced for any reason, Contractor shall, within ten (10) business days of the reduction, replace with the same or greater number of personnel with equal ability, experience, and qualifications, subject to the Participating State's approval. The Participating State, in its sole discretion, may approve additional time beyond the ten (10) business days for replacement of personnel. The Contractor shall include status reports of its efforts and progress in finding replacements and the effect of the absence of the personnel on the progress of the Agreement. The Contractor shall also make interim arrangements to assure that the Agreement progress is not affected by the loss of personnel. The Participating State reserves the right to require a change in Contractor's personnel if the assigned personnel are not, in the sole opinion of the Participating State, meeting the Participating State's expectations.
- **37.** <u>Incorporation by Reference and Precedence:</u> In the event of a dispute under this Agreement, applicable documents will be referred to for the purpose of clarification or for additional detail in the following order of precedence: (1) this Participating Addendum; (2) the Master Lease Agreement, if applicable; and (3) the NASPO ValuePoint Master Agreement.
- **38.** <u>Insurance:</u> If the Services contemplated under this Agreement will be performed on or in Participating State facilities or property, Contractor shall maintain in force during the entire term of this Agreement, the following insurance coverage(s), naming the State of New Mexico, General Services Department or other party to this Agreement as additional insured.
 - **a)** Workers Compensation (including accident and disease coverage) at the statutory limit. Employers liability: \$100,000.
 - b) Comprehensive general liability (including endorsements providing broad form property damage, personal injury coverage and contractual assumption of liability for all liability the Contractor has assumed under this Agreement). Limits shall not be less than the following:
 - (1) Combined Single Limit: \$1,000,000 per person /\$1,000,000 per occurrence.
 - (2) Property damage or combined single limit coverage: \$1,000,000.
 - (3) Automobile liability (including non-owned automobile coverage): \$1,000,000.
 - (4) Umbrella: \$1,000,000.
 - c) Contractor shall maintain the above insurance for the term of this Agreement and name the State of New Mexico, General Services Department or other party to this Agreement as an additional insured and provide for 30 days cancellation notice on any Certificate of Insurance form furnished by Contractor. Such certificate shall also specifically state the coverage provided under the policy is primary over any other valid and collectible insurance and provide a waiver of subrogation.
- **39.** <u>Arbitration:</u> Any controversy or claim arising between the Parties shall be settled by arbitration pursuant to NMSA 1978 § 44-7A-1 *et seq*.
- **40.** New Mexico Administrative Reporting and Fees: All contracts and Purchase Orders arising out of this agreement shall be deemed to include an Administrative Fee assessment at the rate of **one**

percent (1.00 %) for the gross total sales and other revenues (including commissions and fees charged). This assessment shall apply to all New Mexico state agencies and local public bodies. "Gross total sales" means any invoiced amount less any applicable state and local taxes.

For reporting purposes: list payments received for the issued invoice during the applicable quarter by state agency, local public body and invoice number. The Quarters are as follows.
