These modifications or additions apply only to actions and relationships within the Participating Entity.

U.S. FUNDS: All prices and payments must be in U.S. dollars.

ACCESS AND RETENTION OF RECORDS: Contractor agrees to provide the department, Legislative Auditor, or their authorized agents, access to any records necessary to determine contract compliance. (Section 18-1-118, MCA). Contractor agrees to create and retain records supporting the services rendered or supplies delivered for a period of eight years after either the completion date of the contract or the conclusion of any claim, litigation, or exception relating to the contract taken by State of Montana or third party.

ASSIGNMENT, TRANSFER AND SUBCONTRACTING: Contractor shall not assign, transfer or subcontract any portion of the contract without the express written consent of the department. (Section 18-4-141, MCA.)

COMPLIANCE WITH LAWS: Contractor shall, in performance of work under this contract, fully comply with all applicable federal, state, or local laws, rules, and regulations, including but not limited to, the Montana Human Rights Act, the Equal Pay Act of 1963, the Civil Rights Act of 1964, the Age Discrimination Act of 1975, the Americans with Disabilities Act of 1990, and Section 504 of the Rehabilitation Act of 1973. Contractor is the employer for the purpose of providing healthcare benefits and paying any applicable penalties, fees and taxes under the Patient Protection and Affordable Care Act [P.I. 111-148, 124 Stat. 119]. Any subletting or subcontracting by Contractor subjects its subcontractors to the same provisions. In accordance with Section 49-3-207, MCA, Contractor agrees that the hiring of persons to perform this contract will be made on the basis of merit and qualifications and there will be no discrimination based upon race, color, religion, creed, political ideas, sex, age, marital status, physical or mental disability, or national origin by the persons performing this contract.

CONFORMANCE WITH CONTRACT: No alteration of the terms, conditions, delivery, price, quality, quantities, or specifications of the contract shall be granted without State Procurement Bureau's prior written consent. Product or services provided that do not conform to the contract terms, conditions, and specifications may be rejected and returned at Contractor's expense.

DISABILITY ACCOMMODATIONS: State does not discriminate on the basis of disability in admission to, access to, or operations of its programs, services, or activities. Individuals who

Interested parties should provide as much advance notice as possible.

FORCE MAJEURE: Neither party is responsible for failure to fulfill its obligations due to causes beyond its reasonable control, including without limitation, acts or omissions of government or military authority, acts of God, materials shortages, transportation delays, fires, floods, labor disturbances, riots, wars, terrorist acts, or any other causes, directly or indirectly beyond the reasonable control of the nonperforming party, so long as such party uses its best efforts to remedy such failure or delays. A party affected by a force majeure condition shall provide written notice to the other party within a reasonable time of the onset of the condition. In no event, however, shall the notice be provided later than five working days after the onset. If the notice is not provided within the five-day period, then a party may not claim a force majeure event. A force majeure condition suspends a party's obligations under this contract, unless the parties mutually agree that the obligation need not be performed because of the condition.

DEFENSE, INDEMNIFICATION / HOLD HARMLESS: Contractor shall defend, indemnify and hold harmless State of Montana and the contracting agency hereunder and their elected and appointed officials, agents, and employees, while acting within the scope of their duties as such, from and against all claims, demands, causes of action, liabilities, damages, judgments, expenses or fees, including the reasonable cost of defense thereof and attorney fees, arising or awarded in favor of Contractor's or its subcontractor's employees or agents or third parties for bodily or personal injuries, death, damage to property, or financial or other loss resulting or allegedly resulting in whole or part from: (1) the services performed or products provided; or (2) other acts or omissions of Contractor and/or its agents, employees, representatives, assigns, subcontractors, except for the sole negligence of State.

PAYMENT TERM: All payment terms will be computed from the date of delivery of supplies or services OR upon receipt of a properly executed invoice, whichever is later. Unless otherwise noted in the solicitation document, State is allowed 30 days to pay properly executed invoices. All contractors will provide banking information at the time of contract execution in order to facilitate State electronic funds transfer payments.

SERVICES: Contractor shall provide, through their authorized Dealer(s), installation, design, project management and reconfiguration services. Based on the project, specific services will be negotiated between and quoted by Contractor's Authorized Dealer and State.

REDUCTION OF FUNDING: State must terminate this contract if funds are not appropriated or otherwise made available to support State's continuation of performance in a subsequent fiscal period. (Section 18-4-313(4), MCA.)

REFERENCE TO CONTRACT: The contract or purchase order number MUST appear on all invoices, packing lists, packages, and correspondence pertaining to the contract.

SEVERABILITY CLAUSE: A declaration by any court, or any other binding legal source, that any provision of the contract is illegal and void shall not affect the legality and enforceability of any other provision of the contract, unless the provisions are mutually dependent.

TAX EXEMPTION: State of Montana is exempt from Federal Excise Taxes (#81-0302402) except as otherwise provided in the federal Patient Protection and Affordable Care Act [P.I 111-148, 124 Stat. 119].

TERMINATION OF CONTRACT: Unless otherwise stated, either Party may, by written notice to the other Party, terminate this Contract in whole or in part at any time without cause and without incurring in liability. The Party who is terminating the contract shall give notice of termination to the other Party at least 30 days before the effective date of termination. State shall pay Contractor only that amount, or prorated portion thereof, owing to Contractor up to the date of State's termination. This is Contractor's sole remedy. State shall not be liable to Contractor for any other payments or damages arising from termination, including but not limited to general, special, or consequential damages such as lost profits or revenue. State may terminate this Contract in whole or in part for Contractor's failure to materially perform any of the services, duties, terms, or conditions contained in the Contract after giving Contractor written notice of the stated failure. The written notice must demand performance of the stated failure within a specified period of time of not less than 30 days. If the demanded performance is not complete within the specified period, the termination is effective at the end of the 30-day notice period.

VENUE: This Contract is governed by the laws of Montana. The parties agree that any litigation concerning thiscContract must be brought in the First Judicial District in and for the County of Lewis and Clark, State of Montana, and each party shall pay its own costs and attorney fees. (Section 18-1-401, MCA.)

REQUIRED INSURANCE

<u>General Requirements.</u> Contractor shall maintain for the duration of this Contract, at its cost and expense, insurance against claims for injuries to persons or damages to property, including contractual liability, which may arise from or in connection with the performance of the work by

Contractor, agents, employees, representatives, assigns, or subcontractors. This insurance shall cover such claims as may be caused by any negligent act or omission.

<u>Primary Insurance.</u> Contractor's insurance coverage shall be the primary insurance with respect to State, its officers, officials, employees, and volunteers and shall apply separately to each project or location. Any insurance or self-insurance maintained by State, its officers, officials, employees, or volunteers shall be excess of Contractor's insurance and shall not contribute with it.

<u>Specific Requirements for Commercial General Liability.</u> Contractor shall purchase and maintain occurrence coverage with combined single limits for bodily injury, personal injury, and property damage of \$1,000,000 per occurrence and \$2,000,000 aggregate per year to cover such claims as may be caused by any act, omission, or negligence of Contractor or its officers, agents, representatives, assigns, or subcontractors.

State, its officers, officials, employees, and volunteers are to be covered and listed as additional insureds for liability arising out of activities performed by or on behalf of Contractor, including the insured's general supervision of Contractor, products, and completed operations, and the premises owned, leased, occupied, or used.

Specific Requirements for Automobile Liability. Contractor shall purchase and maintain coverage with split limits of \$500,000 per person (personal injury), \$1,000,000 per accident occurrence (personal injury), and \$100,000 per accident occurrence (property damage), OR combined single limits of \$1,000,000 per occurrence to cover such claims as may be caused by any act, omission, or negligence of Contractor or its officers, agents, representatives, assigns, or subcontractors.

State, its officers, officials, employees, and volunteers are to be covered and listed as additional insureds for automobiles leased, owned, or borrowed by Contractor.

<u>Deductibles and Self-Insured Retentions.</u> Any deductible or self-insured retention must be declared to and approved by State. At the request of State either: (1) the insurer shall reduce or eliminate such deductibles or self-insured retentions with State, its officers, officials, employees, or volunteers; or (2) at the expense of Contractor, Contractor shall procure a bond guaranteeing payment of losses and related investigations, claims administration, and defense expenses.

<u>Certificate of Insurance/Endorsements.</u> A certificate of insurance from an insurer with a Best's rating of no less than A- indicating compliance with the required coverages has been

received by State Procurement Bureau, P.O. Box 200135, Helena, MT 59620-0135. The certificate must name the State of Montana as certificate holder and Contractor shall provide copies of additional insured endorsements required by Contractor's commercial general liability and automobile liability policies. Contractor must notify State immediately of any material change in insurance coverage, such as changes in limits, coverages, change in status of policy, etc. State reserves the right at any time to require complete copies of insurance policies.

5. Administrative Fees and Reporting Requirements

5.1. STATE OF MONTANA ADMINISTRATIVE FEE

The State of Montana assesses an Administrative Fee of one and one-half percent (1.50%) for all net sales (sales less credits and returns) made under this PA. The prices paid to Contractor must include the 1.5% Administrative Fee. Contractor shall remit this Administrative Fee concurrent with the Required Usage Reporting described below. The Administrative Fee must be submitted by ACH along with email notification to the State of Montana Contracts Officer. This Administrative Fee is effective upon execution of this PA.

5.2. REQUIRED REPORTING

Contractor shall submit quarterly reports to the Contracts Officer (CO) assigned by the State to manage this Contract. Contractor shall provide CO with an electronic usage report (Excel), whichat a minimum must list the following: purchasing entity; description of items purchased; date of purchase; contract price; and the extended price for each transaction. These reports are due no more than 30 days after the end of the quarter.

First Quarter: July 1 through September 30

Second Quarter: October 1 through December 31

Third Quarter: January 1 through March 31

Fourth Quarter: April 1 through June 30

5.3. TAXES

- Furnish a delivery schedule and designate the mode of delivery carrier;

Nondiscrimination

These regulations restrict awards, subawards, and contracts with certain parties that are debarred, suspended, or otherwise excluded from or ineligible for participation in Federal assistance programs or activities.

Buy American Act.

In addition, the Memorandum of Understanding between the United States of America, and the European Economic Community (EEC) on Government Procurement, and the North American Free Trade Agreement (NAFTA), provide that EEC and NAFTA end products and construction materials are exempted from application of the Buy American Act.

Uniform Relocation Assistance and real Property Acquisition Polices
