# 4. Participating Entity Modifications Or Additions To The Master Agreement

This PA and relationship between Participating Entity and Contractor shall not amend or affect other participating addendums or the Master Agreement itself.

### 4.1. PAYMENT TERM

All payment terms are computed from the date of delivery of supplies or services OR receipt of a properly executed invoice, whichever is later. Unless otherwise noted in the solicitation document, the State is allowed 30 days to pay such invoices. All contractors are required to provide banking information at the time of PA execution in order to facilitate State electronic funds transfer payments.

### 4.2. U.S. FUNDS

All prices and payments must be in U.S. dollars.

### 4.3. REFERENCE TO PA

The Purchase Order number MUST appear on all invoices, packing lists, packages, and correspondence pertaining to this PA.

### 4.4. STATE OF MONTANA ADMINISTRATIVE FEE

The State of Montana assesses an Administrative Fee of one and one-half percent (1.50%) for all net sales (sales less credits and returns) made under this PA. The prices paid to Contractor must include the 1.5% Administrative Fee. Contractor shall remit this Administrative Fee concurrent with the Required Usage Reporting described below. The Administrative Fee must be submitted by ACH along with email notification to the State of Montana Contracts Officer. This Administrative Fee is effective upon execution of this PA.

### 4.5. REQUIRED REPORTING

Contractor shall submit quarterly reports to the Contracts Officer (CO) assigned by the State to manage this PA. Contractor shall provide CO with an electronic usage report (Excel), which must list the following information at the minimum: purchasing entity; description of items purchased; date of purchase; contract price; and the extended price for each transaction. These reports are due no more than 30 days after the end of the quarter.

First Quarter: July 1 through September 30

Second Quarter: October 1 through December 31

Third Quarter: January 1 through March 31

### 4.6. TAXES

4.6.1. Exemption. State of Montana is exempt from Federal Excise Taxes (#81-0302402) except as otherwise provided in the federal Patient Protection and Affordable Care Act [P.I. 111-148, 124 Stat. 119].

<u>4.6.2.</u> All purchasers under this PA shall provide Contractor with a tax exemption certificate.

### 4.7. DELIVERY

Weekends and holidays excepted, deliveries shall be F.O.B. DESTINATION, to the location shown below. The term "F.O.B. destination" as used in this clause, means free of expense to the State and delivered to the location specified. Contractor shall:

- Pack and mark the shipment to comply with specifications or if the specifications do not contain specific packing or marking instructions, pack and mark the shipment in accordance with prevailing commercial practices and in such a manner as to ensure delivery in good condition;
- Prepare and distribute commercial bills of lading and Material Safety Data Sheets (MSDS) as appropriate;
- Deliver the shipment in good order and condition to the point of delivery specified in the ordering documents;
- Be responsible for any loss of and/or damage to the goods occurring before receipt of the shipment by the State at the delivery point specified in the ordering documents;
- Furnish a delivery schedule and designate the mode of delivery carrier;
   and
- •Pay and bear all charges to the specified points of delivery.

### 4.8. WARRANTY FOR SERVICES

All services supplied under this PA shall be fully guaranteed by Contractor for a minimum period of ninety (90) days from the date of acceptance by State. Any defects of design, workmanship, or delivered materials that are in non-compliance shall be fully corrected by Contractor's authorized dealer without cost to State. This warranty is separate from the product warranty.

### 4.9. INSURANCE

Contractor shall provide the Participating Entity the same insurance as it has provided the State of Utah in the Master Agreement and include State as an additional insured on these policies as it has the State of Utah. Electronic delivery of certificates of insurance and any endorsements shall be sent to the Primary Contact for State.

Contractor warrants that it performs all services using reasonable care and skill and according to its current description (including any completion criteria) contained in this PA. State agrees to provide timely written notice of any failure to comply with this warranty so that Contractor can take immediate corrective action.

### 4.10. RECORD ACCESS AND RETENTION

- 4.10.1. Access to Records. Contractor shall provide State, the Montana legislative auditor, or its authorized agents access to any records pertinent to this PA necessary to audit for agreement compliance. State may terminate this agreement, without incurring liability, for Contractor's refusal to allow access as required by this section. (18-1-118, MCA)
- <u>4.10.2.</u> <u>Retention Period.</u> Contractor shall retain all records related to this PA for 8 years following the termination or expiration of this PA.

### 4.11. ASSIGNMENT, TRANSFER AND SUBCONTRACTING

Contractor shall not assign, transfer or subcontract any portion of this PA without the express written consent of State, and State shall not unreasonably withhold consent. (Section 18-4-141, MCA.)

### 4.12. COMPLIANCE WITH LAWS:

- 4.12.1. Compliance. In performing its duties under this PA, Contractor shall comply with all applicable federal, state, and local laws, rules, ordinances, and executive orders.
- 4.12.2. Patient Protection and Affordable Care Act. Contractor is the employer of its employees for the purpose of providing healthcare benefits to its employees and paying any applicable penalties, fees and taxes under the Patient Protection and Affordable Care Act [P.L. 111-148, 124 Stat. 119].
- <u>4.12.3.</u> Hiring Practices. In accordance with 49-3-207, MCA, and Executive Order No. 04-2016, Contractor agrees:
- (a) the hiring of persons to fulfill Contractor's duties under this PA will be made based on merit and qualifications; and

- <u>4.13.3. Costs and Attorney Fees.</u> Each party shall pay its own costs and attorney fees, except as otherwise stated in this PA.

### 4.14. SEVERABILITY

A declaration by any court, or any other binding legal source, that any provision of the PA is illegal and void shall not affect the legality and enforceability of any other provision of the PA, unless the provisions are mutually dependent.

# Federal Terms and Conditions (Non-Construction)

When an order is funded, in whole or in part, by Federal funds, the Purchasing Entity will notify Contractor prior to Contractor's acceptance of the order.

### **Nondiscrimination**

Contractor agrees that no person shall be denied benefits of, or otherwise be subjected to discrimination in connection with the Contractor's performance under this PA, on the ground of race, religion, color, national origin, sex or handicap. Accordingly and to the extent applicable, the Contractor agrees to comply with the following national policies prohibiting discrimination:

- a. On the basis of race, color or national origin, in Title VI of the Civil Rights Act of 1964 (42 U.S.C. Section 2000d et seq.) as implemented by DoD regulations at 32 CFR part 195.
- b. On the basis of race, color, religion, sex, or national origin, in Executive Order 11246 {3 CFR, 1964-1965 Comp. pg. 339}, as implemented by Department of Labor regulations at 41 CFR part 60.
- c. On the basis of sex or blindness, in Title IX of the Education Amendments of 1972 (20 U.S.C. 1681, et seq.), as implemented by DoD regulations at 32 CFR part 196.
- d. On the basis of age, in The Age Discrimination Act of 1975 (42 U.S.C. Section 6101 et seq.), as implemented by Department of Health and Human Services regulations at 45 CFR part 90.
- e. On the basis of handicap, in Section 504 of the Rehabilitation Act of 1973 (29 U.S.C. 794), as implemented by Department of Justice regulations at 28 CFR part 41 and DoD regulations at 32 CFR part 56.

### Lobbying

  - 8) To identify any impact this PA may have on the quality of the human environment and provide help as needed to comply with the National Environmental Policy Act (NEPA, at 42 U.S.C. 4321, et seq.) and any applicable federal, state or local environmental regulation.
- b. In accordance with the EPA rules, the parties further agree that the Contractor/Vendor shall also identify to State any impact this PA may have on:

Contactor agrees that travel under this PA shall use U.S.-flag air carriers (air carriers holding certificates under 49 U.S.C. 41102) for international air transportation of people and property to the extent that such service is available, in accordance with the International Air Transportation Fair Competitive Practices Act of 1974 (49 U.S.C. 40118) and the inter-operative guidelines issued by the Comptroller General of the United States in the March 31, 1981, amendment to Comptroller General Decision B138942.

The Contactor/Vendor agrees that it will comply with the Cargo Preference Act of 1954 (46 U.S.C. Chapter 553), as implemented by Department of Transportation regulation at 46 CFR 381.7, and 46 CFR 381.7(b).

### **Debarment and Suspension.**

Contractor is subject to the non-procurement debarment and suspension regulations implementing Executive Orders 12549 and 12689, 2 CFR Part 180. These regulations restrict awards, subawards, and contracts with certain parties that are debarred, suspended, or otherwise excluded from or ineligible for participation in Federal assistance programs or activities.

Contractor agrees to comply with the DOD implementation of 2 CFR part 180 (at 2 CFR 1125) by checking the Excluded Parties List System (EPLS) at the current OMB website to verify (sub)contractor eligibility to receive contracts and subcontracts resulting from this PA. The Contractor shall not solicit offers from, nor award contracts to contractors listed in EPLS. This verification shall be documented in the Contractors contract files and

## Buy American Act.

Contractor agrees that it will not expend any funds appropriated by Congress without complying with The Buy American Act (41 U.S.C. 10a et seq). The Buy American Act gives preference to domestic end products and domestic construction material. In addition, the Memorandum of Understanding between the United States of America, and the European Economic Community (EEC) on Government Procurement, and the North American Free Trade Agreement (NAFTA), provide that EEC and NAFTA end products and construction materials are exempted from application of the Buy American Act. Agency shall notify the authorized Contractor dealer on any order that requires compliance with The Buy American Act.

## **Uniform Relocation Assistance and real Property Acquisition Polices**

Contractor agrees that it will comply with CFR 49 part 24, which implements the provisions of the Uniform Relocation Assistance and Real Property Acquisition Policies Act of 1970 (42 U.S.C. § 4601 et seq.) and provides for fair and equitable treatment of persons displaced by federally assisted programs or persons whose property is acquired as a result of such programs.

# Copeland "Anti-Kickback" Act

Contractor agrees that it will comply with the Copeland "Anti-Kickback" Act (18 U.S.C. 874) as supplemented in Department of Labor regulations (29 CFR Part 3). As applied to this PA, the Copeland "Anti-Kickback" Act makes it unlawful to induce, by force, intimidation, threat or procuring dismissal from employment, or otherwise, any person employed in the construction or repair of public buildings or public works, financed in whole or in part by the United States, to give up any part of the compensation to which that person is entitled under a contract of employment.

### **Contract Work Hours and Safety Standards Act**

Contractor agrees that it will comply with Sections 103 and 107 of the Contract Work Hours and Safety Standards Act (40 U.S.C. 3701-3708) as supplemented by Department of Labor regulations (29 CFR Part 5). As applied to this PA, the Contract Work Hours and Safety Standards Act specifies that no laborer or mechanic doing any part of the work contemplated by this PA shall be required or permitted to work more than 40 hours in any workweek unless paid for all additional hours at not less than 1.5 times the basic rate of pay.

### Rights to Inventions Made Under a Contract or Agreement.

Any discovery or invention that arises during the course of this PA shall be reported to the non-Federal entity. Contractor/Vendor must comply with the requirements of 37 CFR Part 401, "Rights to Inventions Made by Nonprofit Organizations and Small Business Firms under Government Grants, Contracts and Cooperative Agreements," and any

Any Contract or subcontract in excess of \$150,000 must comply with all applicable standards, orders or regulations issued pursuant to the Clean Air Act (42 U.S.C. 7401-7671q) and the Federal Water Pollution Control Act, as amended (33 U.S.C. 1251-1387). Violations must be reported to the State who in turn will report to the Federal awarding agency and the Regional Office of the Environmental Protection Agency (EPA).

### Byrd Anti-Lobbying Amendment (31 U.S.C. 1352)

Contractors that bid for an <u>award exceeding \$100,000</u> must file the required certification. Each tier must also disclose any lobbying with non-Federal funds that takes place in connection with obtaining any Federal award. Such disclosures are forwarded from tier to tier up to the non-Federal award.

### System For Award Management and Unique Entity Identification Number Requirements.

Contractor agrees to comply with the System for Award Management (Sam.gov) maintained by the General Services Administration. Contractor shall provide a Unique Entity ID assigned to it.

### Procurement of recovered materials.

Contractor must comply with section 6002 of the Solid Waste Disposal Act, as amended by the Resource Conservation and Recovery Act. The requirements of Section 6002 include procuring only items designated in guidelines of the Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) at 40 CFR part 247 that contain the highest percentage of recovered materials practicable, consistent with maintaining a satisfactory level of competition, where the purchase price of the item exceeds \$10,000 or the value of the quantity acquired during the preceding fiscal year exceeded \$10,000; procuring solid waste management services in a manner that maximizes energy and resource recovery; and establishing an affirmative procurement program for procurement of recovered materials identified in the EPA guidelines.

### 2 C.F.R. 200.326, Appendix II, Required Contract Clauses

2 C.F.R. 200.326, Appendix II, Required Contract Clauses are incorporated by reference as if set forth in full text and are made part of this agreement as applicable.
