This week the eyes of the Project are concentrated on the Concrete, Brick

Layers, and Fumperete Gangs.

Past experience on this Project has brought to light the extreme hazards involved with this type of work. To better understand and respect these hazards it is well to review the conditions under which the Craft operates.

Pumperete lines by necessity are hurridly clamped together and placed on an A frame support. Because of excessive vibration these lines cannot be anchored to the high scaffolds. Since they operate under high pressure it is important that they be given respect and clearance. Often it is necessary to "go-devil" or flush out the lines and the concrete will, spatter with a propellant speed. It is essential that precautions be taken to keep workmen in the clear. In planning overhead work it is well to remember that when concrete pour is begun it cannot be stopped and trowell- a fresh start that goes with Spring ing must be done before the concrete "sats up."

The chief hazards of bricklaying are in the possibility of brick falling to the area below and eye hazards involved in the breaking and chipping of brick. When possible, barricades or canopies should be placed below the scaffolds of bricklayers.

The Safety enthusiasm of the Concrete Craft affects us all.
