## FIRE DAMAGES HOME

### FREE TENNIS LESSONS START WEDNESDAY MAY 3

A series of tennis classes open to all men, women, boys and girls of Richland will start Wednesday, May 3, at Richland Park Courts.

Lessons are designed both for beginners and more advanced players. The instructor will be Roland Bloomstrand, veteran tournament player. He will assist players in the purchase of necessary equipment, in addition to serving as coordinator of tennis for the Richland Community Association.

Schedule of classes is as follows:  
Wednesdays - Women - Beginners 7:00 to 7:30 p.m., More Advanced Players 7:30 to 8:00 p.m.; Thursdays - Women - 9:00 to 10:00 a.m., Men - Beginners 7:00 to 7:30 p.m., More Advanced Players 7:30 to 8:00 p.m.; Saturdays - Boys - Beginners 9:00 to 9:30 a.m., More Advanced Players 9:30 to 10:00 a.m., Girls - Beginners 10:00 to 10:30 a.m., More Advanced Players 10:30 to 11:00 a.m.

Persons wishing to enter these classes should wear tennis shoes or other suitable low heeled shoes and bring their rackets. Balls can be purchased at the courts.

### MAKE RESERVATIONS FOR RECREATION FACILITIES

If you want to cook a picnic supper in the park, or have a baseball or softball game on one of the available diamonds, be sure to get your reservation in early. Reservations should be made by calling J. P. Gorman, R-411.

Due to the increasing demand for these facilities, and in fairness to all concerned, persons wishing to use the fireplaces in the park, the baseball fields, or - when completed - the tennis courts, are asked to make advance reservations. There is no charge for the use of these facilities. Reservations are granted in order of receipt of applications.

### ALL VILLAGE TENANTS WARNED TO REMOVE MATERIALS STORED NEAR FURNACES, PIPES

A serious fire occurred in the Village on April 24, starting in the basement of a new home, only recently occupied, and spreading throughout the entire house. The fire started when a trunk and other materials stored against the flue and hot air pipe of the furnace became overheated and ignited.

The hot air pipes in the new Richland houses are not insulated; and it is essential that nothing be stored against or near these pipes.

Every resident of Richland is urged to check his basement at once and make certain that nothing is stored within three feet of the furnace or of any hot air pipe.

### CALL TENANT SERVICE FOR VICTORY GARDEN INFORMATION

Residents of the Village who have not received victory garden assignments are asked to call at Tenant Service, Bldg. 713, to secure their garden plot assignments. This information will be available at Tenant Service between the hours of 8:00 a.m. and 4:30 p.m., Monday, May 1, through Wednesday, May 3. Those who find it impossible to call on those days can secure information on their garden assignments by calling Richland 56 on Thursday, May 4.

Due to a reduction of manpower, the policy of delivering garden permits directly to the homes, as announced in the last issue of the Bulletin, has been discontinued.

Gardeners are asked to watch the backs of the signs at the victory gardens for important bulletins on gardening.
