DRUG STORE TO OPEN

SUMMER SCHOOL OPENS MONDAY AT THE LEWIS GRADE SCHOOL

School District No. 400 Summer School for the Richland area will be held at the Lewis Grade School from June 12,1944 through July 21, 1944, with classes opening at 8:00 a.m. and concluding at 12:30 p.m. Monday through Friday. The classes are limited to children of grade school age who need courses for proper grade enrollment in the fall.

Special bus transportation arrangements have been made. Children are requested to ride the school buses, which will leave the bus terminal at 7:30 a.m., follow the regular Village bus routes (Symons, Hunt, and Van Gesen), and then go direct to the Grade School. The return trip will leave from the school at 12:30 p.m.

Bus service will also be provided for students living in rural areas. Parents are requested to call the school (Richland 184) to make arrangements for this service
