POWER DOWN SUNDAY

CHILD HEALTH CONFERENCES NOW AT KADLEC HOSPITAL

The weekly Child Health Conferences, which have been held each Tuesday at the Grange Hall, will be held in the future at the Public Health Office in the northwest wing of Kadlec Hospital. This change becomes effective as of next Tuesday, August 1. The conference will start, as before, at 1:00 p.m.

PAPER DRIVE TO OPEN SOON

During the week of August 7, an all-out drive to collect all salvageable waste paper in Richland will get under way. This drive to collect waste paper is in answer to the acute national paper shortage which has now reached the alarming figure of 87,000 tons monthly.

During the opening week of the drive Richland residents will be visited by representatives of various youth organizations in the Village. Newspapers, magazines, cartons, and other salvageable waste paper accumulated by residents will be picked up and removed by these representatives. Thereafter homes will be visited once each two weeks.

PLAY POSTPONED ONE WEEK

"Night of January 16th", the play scheduled by the Richland Village Players for presentation this Saturday at Columbia High School Auditorium, has been postponed for one week.

The mystery court room drama will be presented next Saturday, August 5, at 8:45 p.m. in the school auditorium.

The reason for the change is to permit the judge, jury, cast, and audience to attend the Safety Exposition at Hanford, another event that no one in the Village will want to miss!

HIGH SCHOOL BOYS TO MEET WEDNESDAY AT PARK

All Richland High School boys or boys who will be of high school age in the fall are invited to a meeting on Wednesday evening, August 2, at 7:00 p.m. at the southeast corner of Richland Park. The meeting will be in charge of John Eubank and is for the purpose of discussing plans for a fall recreation program.

On Sunday, July 30, there will be two power shutdowns affecting the entire Village - one starting at 6:00 a.m. and ending at 9:00 a.m., and a second starting at 4:00 p.m. and ending at 5:30 p.m.

In the Prefab. area only the shutdown will begin at 6:00 a.m. and continue until 5:30 p.m. The Kadlec Hospital is offering the use of its refrigeration facilities between the hours of 9:00 a.m. and 4:00 p.m. to residents of the Prefab. area - especially those having small children - who must keep milk or perishable foods refrigerated during the period of the shutdown.

Village residents are asked to keep all electrical connections turned off during the power shutdowns and to use only a minimum necessary amount of water. Lawns are not to be watered during the shutdown periods.

The Richland Cafeteria will serve breakfast from 10:00 to 11:30 a.m., lunch from 11:30 a.m. to 1:30 p.m., and dinner from 6:30 p.m. to 8:30 p.m.

The Richland Theater will have one matinee showing starting at 1:00 p.m. and one evening showing at 7:00 p.m.

PICNIC FOR ALL OPERATIONS EMPLOYEES

A "get acquainted" picnic for Operations Employees and their families will be held at Richland Park on Sunday, August 6, 1944, starting at 3:00 p.m.

There are now at Richland operations employees and their families from many sections of the country, from various plants and subsidiary companies. The picnic on August 6 will provide an opportunity for these family groups to get acquainted, with particular reference to the wives and the children. The picnic is to be a family affair, so "bring the kids."

Further details will be made available during the coming week through area supervision.
