**SPOTTED FEVER TICK
FOUND ON SAGEBRUSH**

According to the United States Public Health Service, the Rocky Mountain wood tick, commonly referred to as the Rocky Mountain spotted fever tick or "sage tick", is the transmitting agent of Rocky Mountain spotted fever, tularemia, and other diseases.

The "sage tick" is often found on sagebrush throughout southeastern Washington. For this reason, Richland tenants are requested not to plant sagebrush on their lawns.
