SCHOOLS ANNOUNCE OPENING DATE

Because of the many requests received regarding information pertaining to the Richland schools the following tentative

plans have been made:
GRADE SCHOOLS AND HIGH SCHOOL will open Monday, September 11.

KINDERGARTENS will be located in the Lewis-Clark Grade School (Gillespie and Caples Sts.) and the Sacajawea Grade School (Williams Blvd. and Stevens Dr.). They will be operated on a half-day basis. Enrollment is limited to children who will be five by October 31.

GRADE SCHOOL first grade enrollments are limited to children who will be six by October 31. All eight grades will be housed in the Jefferson (Van Giesen and George Washington Way), the Sacajawea and the: Lewis-Clark Schools, until the prefabricated area school (Marcus Whit-man) is completed. Children living in this area will attend either the Lewis-Clark or the Sacajawea Grade Schools as directed.

HIGH SCHOOL students will be required to produce a transcript of credits and grade school diploma. A four-year type of high school will be operated in Rich-

On Monday, August 14, swimming classes are scheduled to begin at the Richland Park Swimming Pool, under the direction of pool attendants. Classes will be organized on the basis of age and ability, with Beginner, Intermediate, and Advanced groups to be formed.

Beginners are classified as swimmers who cannot swim one width of the pool, nor float in the water for one minute - remaining suspended at the surface without using arm or leg movements. Intermediates are those who can swim one width but less than six widths of the pool and can float for one minute. Advanced swimmers must be able to swim six widths of the pool and remain afloat for one minute.
