#### FRUIT TREES NOT TO BE PLANTED AT HOMES

Residents of the Village are requested to refrain from planting fruit trees at their homes. Due to the lack of rainfall in this region, fruit trees are more subject to diseases than in other regions. The State of Washington has stringent laws covering the care of fruitbearing trees, because of the danger of spreading these diseases to other orchards. To abide by these laws, it is necessary to spray trees at frequent intervals during the summer months with a poisonous spray (presenting a hazard to children who may eat fruit without first washing it). The law also requires the removal of all trees on which the spray does not take, or which cannot be maintained in a healthy condition. For these reasons, no fruit trees are to be planted at homes in the Village.
