WAR BOND SHOW THRUSDAY AT RICHLAND THEATER

As its contribution to the Fifth War Loan Drive, the Richland Theater will hold a War Bond premier showing of the technicolor picture "Home in Indiana" at 9:30 p.m., Thursday, July 6. The Pasco Naval Air Station band will give a concert in front of the theater from 8:30 to 9:30 p.m.

Any person who purchases a Series E bond at the Richland post office, bank or theater between Saturday, July 1 and Thursday, July 6, will receive a souvenir ticket entitling him to admittance to this premier showing.

Because of the special Bond show, there will be only one regular evening showing on Thursday, starting at 7 p.m.

The newly - organized Richland Junior hamber of Commerce, which has just reserved its charter from the state and national organizations, will meet on the second and fourth Wednesdays of each with Officers are: President, Capt. The Richland Post Office advises that mail delivery service in the business district, including dormitories, and in Divisions 1, 2 and 3 (area between Thayer Drive and the Columbia River, south to Williams Blvd.) will start on or shortly before July 10, depending upon the arrival and installation of mail boxes and other necessary equipment. There will be one delivery daily except Sundays and holidays. Service for the remaining divisions of the Village will be established at a later date.

It is important that residents who will receive mail at their homes immediately notify correspondents to address mail to new street addresses (not old house numbers).

### POST OFFICE BOXES

Persons who have requested Post Office boxes will receive slips at the General Delivery window within the next few days advising that these boxes are available. Because of the limited number of boxes, residents who will receive mail on Village delivery routes are requested to turn these slips back to the Post Office signifying that a box is not desired.

#### NURSERY SCHOOL OPENS MONDAY

A nursery school, operated by School District No. 400 under the provisions of the Lanham Act, will open on Monday, July 3 in the Lewis Grade School. Enrollment is limited to children, ages 2 to 6, of families where both parents are employed. A charge of 50 cents per child per day is made to defray the expense of meals.

Hours of the school are 6:30 a.m. to 6:30 p.m. Parents are requested to bring their children to Room 106 at the Lewis Grade School.

An Extended Day Care program has also been set up for children, ages 6 to 15. Arrangements for enrollment in this program should be made with R. H. Fergin, Superintendent, by phoning Richland 388 or applying in person at Room 101 of the Columbia High School.
