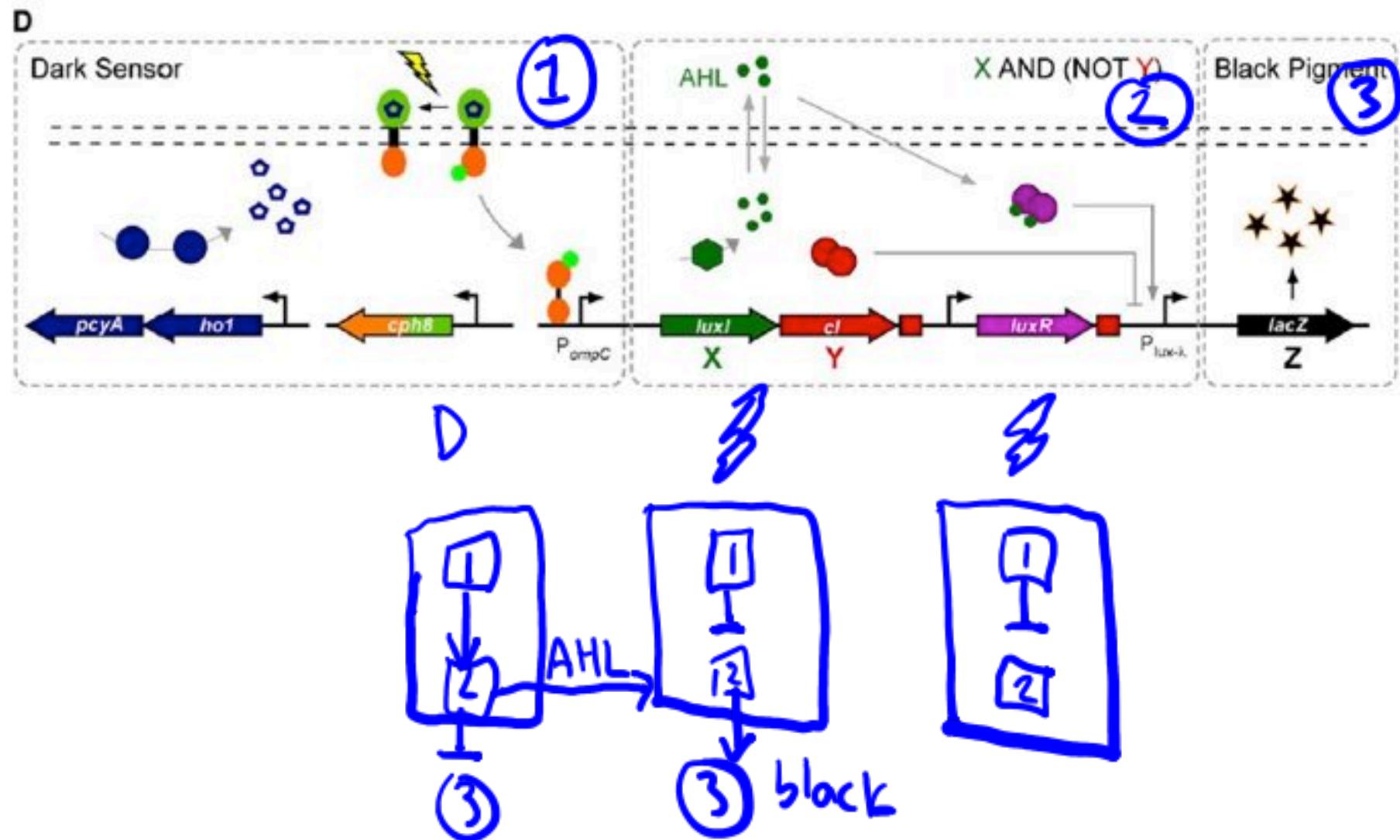

Module 2 goal: improve edge detector



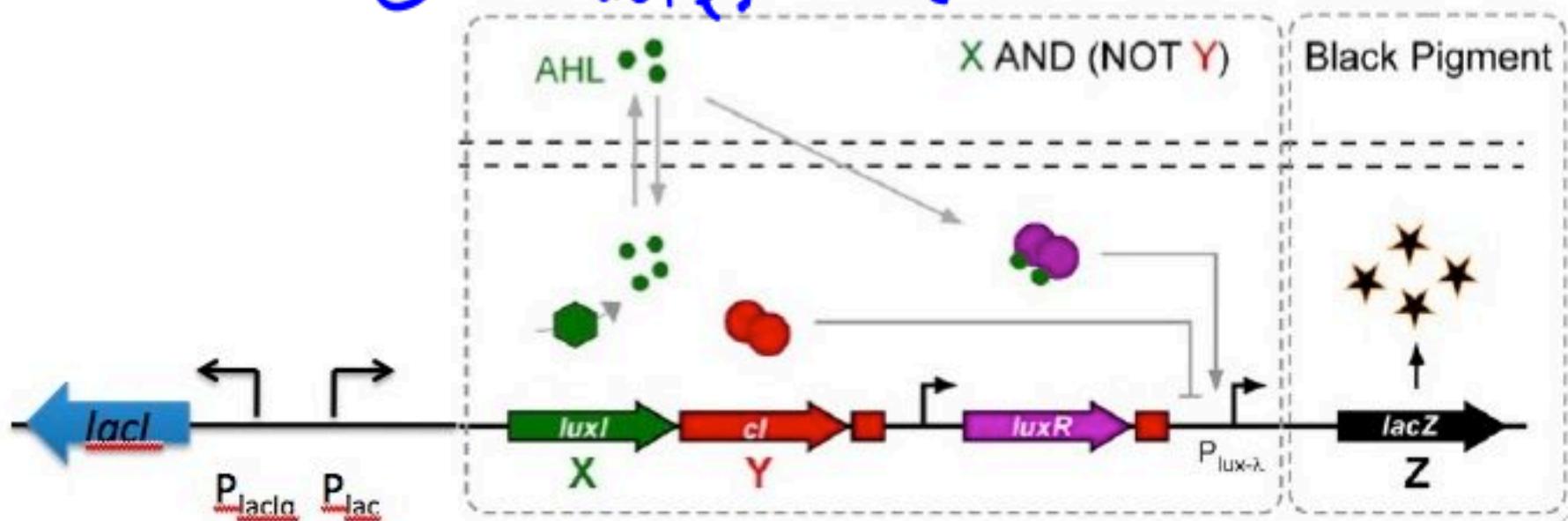
# First: understand original system



# Next: develop model system

Why useful?

- ① light  $\rightarrow$  diffuse small molecule  $\rightarrow$  more exact easier, to test (multiple conditions once)
- ② more subtle; isolate one problem @ a time



## Last: Theoretically, close loop

- ✓ • Gather data on broken and modified model (IPTG-based) system
- ✓ • Gather data on broken original (light) system
- (✓) • Use transfer functions to make predictions about how to fix original edge detector

(Implement modification in original system)

# Working with bacteria

- Sterile technique
  - use sterile equipment and reagents
  - avoid contaminating either one
- Appropriate disposal
  - aspirate liquid cultures into flasks w/bleach
  - toss solid cultures in biohazard bin
- Useful organism
  - they grow quickly!

# Today in Lab: M2D1

  - four possible input combinations
  - next time measure  $\beta$ -gal activity of each
