

Correspondence with Mrs. William Manning
Letter, dated November 9, 1883

Rome. Nov.9. 1883

My dear Child,

A letter from Mrs. Manning tells me that your Sister is gone, & that you are once more at the Convent. She tells me that she has bid you to come to them as much as you can, & as often as you will: and I shall be disappointed if you do not do so. Mrs. Manning writes with true affection about you, & you may trust in her. I have thought of my last letter about the future, & I am more than ever convinced that my judgment about it is right.

Let me hear from you, & write openly. Tell me all about yourself, and whether you are in any need.

I pray for you, & for your husband every day. May God bring you both to Himself with a perfect conversion of heart. Speak with Him when you are sad and lonely. Remember that the best prayers are the few words which say what we feel or fear, or need, or desire.

God guide & guard you.
