My dear Sir,

A letter this morning from Aubrey de Vere gives me the pleasant tadings that I may hope for the fulfilment of your promised visit, to Lavington. I can hardly tell you how sincere & how great delight it would give me.

Although I shall not be alone. The two men who are with me are both students and solitaries so that I should not lose any of the enjoyment of your society. And I so much fear that any thing should again befal to hinder your visit that I will press you to come to me on Saturday next.

Let me, therefore, look forwards as to a pledge that I shall receive you on that day. It may be told today that a coach runs from Godalming to Petworth corresponding with the train which leaves the Waterloo S Station at 1 o'clock.
