## HISTORY OF BOLD SPRINGS

In talking with some of the older members of the Bold Springs Methodist Church, we have obtained some very interesting data concerning its history. Perhaps the most significant fact in the history of the church is that one of the preachers of the North Georgia Conference came from Bold Springs Methodist Church. The Rev. Art Woodruff, now deceased, and his sister, Mrs. Jeannette Still, wife of Thomas Still, united with the Methodist Church in 1898. As far as we can find recorded this is the first and only minister to come from the membership of this charge.

The present building is on the second location on the present property. The first building on the present property was brought from the original location which is near the Allgood home; when constructed on the present property it was immediately in front of the present building.

Bold Springs has been on the Lawrenceville Circuit in the past, but has been with NewHope and the other churches on the Walton Circuit since it was organized from the Monroe Circuit. It has been served by the pastors appointed to the Walton Circuit.

The approximate date of the original church is 1830.

At this time we have not compiled all the data necessary to make a complete history. We plan to do this and when it has been completed, we will file copies with the District Superintendent and the Recording Secretary of the Charge.
