History of Molena Mothodist Church Molena, Georgia

The Melena Methedist Church was erganized en October 31,1892, with Rev. R. B. Hamlin as the first paster. At this time Rev. Joseph Key was Bishop, and Rev. James Bryan was Presiding Elder.

The deed to the lot on which the church stands was made by Mrs. Julia Brooks to Jas. S. Pope, J. H. Hooten, and Theo Rumble. Among the early members were W. F. Cochran, J. H. Hooten, Theo Rumble, and Mrs. S. L. Hardy. The latter being the only living charter member.

For a number of years Melena was in the Griffin District on the Zebulen Charge. Then in the Conference year 1911-12 it was changed to the LaGrange District on the Woodbury Charge.

For a period of a few years we did not have a Church School, but during the pastorate of Rev. Jesse Warwick, he, with Rev. J. C. Adams reorganized our Church School with Mrs. E. P. Jordon as Superintendent. A. L. Watts is the present Superintendent.

The membership has never been large, but we feel that our church has filled an important place in the religious life of the community.

Various repairs and improvements have been made on the original building since its establishment. While Rev. H. C. Holland was paster new pews were put in. Then, during the pasterate of Rev. J. H. Couch wenderful improvement was made. A new roof was put on, the exterior and interior of the church were painted, and venetian blinds were placed in the auditorium. This was at a cost of \$758.84 and \$250.00 of this was given by the Mission Board. Also under the leadership of the present paster, Rev. Forrest L. King, gas heat has been installed, and a carpet, kneeling rail, pulpit stand and pulpit chairs have been placed in the auditorium. Concrete steps have replaced the old wooden ones, and azaleas have been planted in front of the church. All this has been done at a total cost of \$1,106.52.

At present, an important and helpful improvement is being made, Sunday School rooms are under construction and are nearing completion.
