Mountain View Subdivision in the immediate vicinity is a fast-growing community of approximately 90 homes with plans for about 700 homes in the next few years.

XVI. Statements from various individuals

Rev. Peter Manning, First Methodist Church, Newman, Georgia
"It was my pleasure to preach in a series of services during the week
of September 6, 1959, designed to culminate in the erganization of the
Mountain View Methodist Church. We encountered many handicaps, but the
Holy Spirit led and encouraged us day by day. We were handicapped
primarily in that it was necessary to hold the services at the Wallaceville Recreation Center outside of the community for the proposed church,
together with the fact that we had no nucleus of members and unfavorable
weather. Our largest congregation numbered 32. However, the spirit of
the Pastor, Rev. Charles C. Burdette, and the leadership of the Holy
Spirit continued to inspire. We sincerely felt at the time that God would
lead and help in the success of organizing the Mountain View Methodist
Church. Surely 'All things work together for good to them that love the
Lord.'"

#### XVI. (Continued)

Rev. William H. Gardner, College Park, Georgia
"In the spring of 1958, Rev. Paul H. Jordan called to my attention the urgent need for some new churches in the growing edge of Chattanooga in the area of the Dalton District of the North Georgia Conference. About that time the Board of Evangelism of the Conference offered a seminary student for summer work with the Conference Board to pay his salary and

that time the Board of Evangelism of the Conference offered a seminary student for summer work with the Conference Board to pay his salary and his travel and other expenses to be met through the District Promotion Fund. In June 1958, Rev. Thomas E. Fowler, Rev. Clayton Gilmer, and I drove over some of this area and during July and August the seminary student made a sketchy survey of certain areas. The results of this survey indicated that the Mountain View Subdivision and Mission Ridge Road area was the place where a Methodist Church was most needed.

"As District Superintendent, I made numerous trips to this vicinity taking with me pastors in neighboring churches at various times—
Thomas E. Fowler, Clayton Gilmer, Hoyt Henderson, Eugene Dunn, and laymen including L. E. Dietz and Marvin Sisson, Chairman of the District Board of Missions. On one occasion, Rev. M. L. Crowder and I spent an entire day looking at lots and conferring with people. On another occasion, Rev. C. C. Burdette and I did the same. I was convinced that a church could be organized if a suitable site could be procured and a preacher with courage and foresight could be placed in the field. I was able to secure a seminary student from the Board of Evangelism again for 1959. Since sufficient funds were not in sight for a full-time pastor, I considered the Conference fortunate in securing the consent of the Rev. C. C. Burdette to leave a pleasant pastorate after just one year and give himself to this undertaking. We had been able to accumulate a few thousand dollars in Expansion Day funds toward the purchase of a lot. At this juncture, I left the situation in the capable hands of Brother Burdette and my successor as District Superintendent, Rev. E. D. Rudisill."

Mrs. Hawley A. Cline, Mountain View Methodist Church
"Rev. C. C. Burdette and Dan Weaver, a seminary student, worked closely
during the summer of 1959 and together they started the first actual work
toward organizing a church. They made a church membership survey of the
subdivision and told the people of the plans for the new church, stirring
up as much interest as possible. They visited the interested homes to get
an idea of the number of charter members there would be and tried to form a
nucleus.

"Later, discussion groups on the doctrine of the Methodist Church and christian principles were held in various homes. These groups were very small and informal, usually consisting of no more than a half dozen people. The discussion groups proved beneficial and during the week of September 6 an evangelical appeal was held in the Wallaceville Community Center with Rev. Peter Manning holding services.

"On October 11, the Mountain View Methodist Church was organized.
Services were held in the Community Center the following Sunday.
We then moved our meetings to the home of one of the members,
Mr. C. G. Burk, where we met until Sunday, November 29. On this
date the first service was held in the new dwelling-type building
on Mission Ridge Road."
