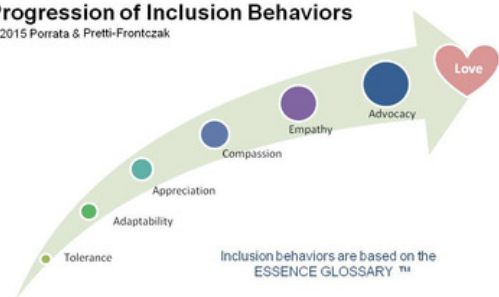

Inclusion Tips At-a-Glance

- There are seven progressions to consider when a child is struggling or development has stalled. Your goal is to, as needed, move from:
 - multiple to single
 - complex to simple
 - abstract to concrete
 - specific to global
 - unpreferred to preferred
 - unfamiliar to familiar
 - others to self
- There is also a progression related to achieving more inclusive practices. Meaning...to work from a place of love over tolerance.

The Power of Play Tips At-a-Glance

- The secret to high-quality early education is in the development of early, meaningful, healthy relationships.
- “Play changes the connections of neurons at the front end of your brain and without play, neurons aren't changed.” -Sergio Pe
- Make "right-sized bids" to children who struggle to engage in cooperative exchanges during play. A bid can and should be quite small at first....it can be a look, a touch, a gesture, and in some cases, a comment (e.g., affirmation of the emotion the student is demonstrating). Avoid asking questions, directing, or redirecting a child's attention and actions.
