This worksheet is to help you figure out your why (your intention) behind creating a temple circle and share a checklist of things to consider when planning it.

YOUR INTENTION & INSPIRATION

Please take some time to journal with the following questions:

What is calling you to create a Beltane Ceremony in your community?

Why are you being called to honor the turn of the wheel?

What is your relationship to this practice? Have you done this before?

When you imagine creating and hosting a Beltane Ceremony, how do you feel?

Take a few moments to imagine what this ceremony might be like. Begin to vision some elements that you might be inspired to bring in.

BELTANE CEREMONY PREPARATION

Whenever I set up ANY temple gathering, I start by reverse engineering. That means that I START with grounding the date and putting it in my calendar. Here is a mind map of the preparation period.



PRACTICAL CHECKLIST

Date & Time of Ritual Celebration:

Make sure to do this part. Once you get it in the calendar, you start to make it real! Best to celebrate Beltane 3 days on either side of May 1st.

Venue:

This could be your back garden, living room, a public park, church, or gathering hall, anywhere that you are connected to! Make it simple. The last Beltane offering I did was in my back garden.

Facebook Post to Announce the Date:

Create a FB post announcing the date of your celebration. Make it public.

Facebook Event:

Create a FB event announcing the date of your celebration. Make it public.

Who Do You Want to Invite?

Make a list of women/men/children that you know who would love to invite.

How Will You Invite Them? Online, in-person, flier, phone call, text, FB, Instagram

Here are some things that you will want to include in your invitation:

- What is a High Holy-day Celebration
- Why do you want to celebrate this high holy-day
- When, where, what time
- What they need to participate: do they wear special colors/ bring offerings/blessings/something for the altar?
- Do they need to bring a potluck dish, blanket, chair, water
- What they will receive from attending

Who Will Support You?

Think here of family, friends, sisters, who maybe called to actually help you plan and have this happen. Remember this is community event, so the more support you can garner, the better!
