

222 Berryton Rd - Tree Planting Plan – Details

Reason for Plan: Treat the former fields in an ecologically conscious way to encourage nature.

Goal: Keep it wild & natural - not manicured - which is why we don't mow or pull dandelions (they are the first food in the spring for bees) or milkweed (for the Monarchs) etc.

We **do not use any pesticides or chemicals** as we are trying to help the bees, insects, birds and salamanders. We have seen all different kinds of salamanders as well as Baltimore Orioles, Pileated Woodpeckers, Nuthatches, Chickadees, Blue Buntings, Pine Siskins, Red Wing Blackbirds, Hummingbirds, Mourning Doves, Cranes, Cardinals, Rose Breasted Grosbeaks, Sparrows, Goldfinches, Wrens, Bluejays, all kinds of woodpeckers, Purple Finches, Phoebes, Flycatchers etc. and there is a pair of Wood ducks nesting in one of the huge maples by the ravine in the back this year.

In the fields, Sellers had 3700 trees planted (see photo for layout)
