Pharisee (far'ə sē): a Jewish ruler who knew the laws of Moses

One dark night a man came to visit Jesus. The Bible does not say why the man came at night. Most likely it was because he wanted to talk with Jesus alone. During the day whenever Jesus appeared in Judea, people gathered around Him. They felt His love for them. They enjoyed hearing Him talk. They hoped to see Him do a miracle. Only after dark, when everyone had gone home, could you hope to talk with Jesus by Himself.

The man's name was
Nicodemus. He was a **Pharisee**.
Pharisees taught the people to
obey the Scriptures. That was
right, because God had given
those laws to Moses. God
wanted His people to obey
them.

However, the Pharisees had made up many other rules. They added them to God's laws and said people must obey them. They said their made-up laws were just as important as God's.

Most Pharisees talked and acted very holy when others were watching them. They pretended to love God. They acted as if they were better than anyone else.



The truth was that many Pharisees were not holy at all. They were proud and greedy and dishonest. They disobeyed their own laws and God's laws. At the same time they expected others to honor them for being wise and good.

Yet not all Pharisees were like that. Nicodemus was a Pharisee, but he did not think he was more holy than the common people. He knew Jesus was one of the common people. Yet he believed the Teacher from Galilee was a man of God. He had questions to ask Him.

He said, "Teacher, we know You have come from God. No one could do the miracles You do unless God were with Him." That is how the ruler of the Jews began his talk with Jesus.

Jesus had said people must repent because the kingdom of Heaven was near. That is not what the Pharisees taught. They believed they were already part of the kingdom, because the Jews were God's chosen people. Besides that, they kept the Law of Moses.

Evidently Nicodemus was not so sure about that. He wanted to know. This Teacher who had come from God ought to be able to tell him how to get into the kingdom.

Jesus said, "Unless a man is born again, he cannot even see the kingdom."

Nicodemus could not understand how anyone could be born as a baby a second time. Who would want to become a child again?

Jesus explained that He was not talking about being born again in that way. He was talking about starting a new life as a child of God. That would take a change in the heart. It was something God did, but you could not see it happen.


Then Jesus said, "For God so loved the world, that He gave His only begotten Son, that whosoever believeth in Him should not perish, but have everlasting life."
