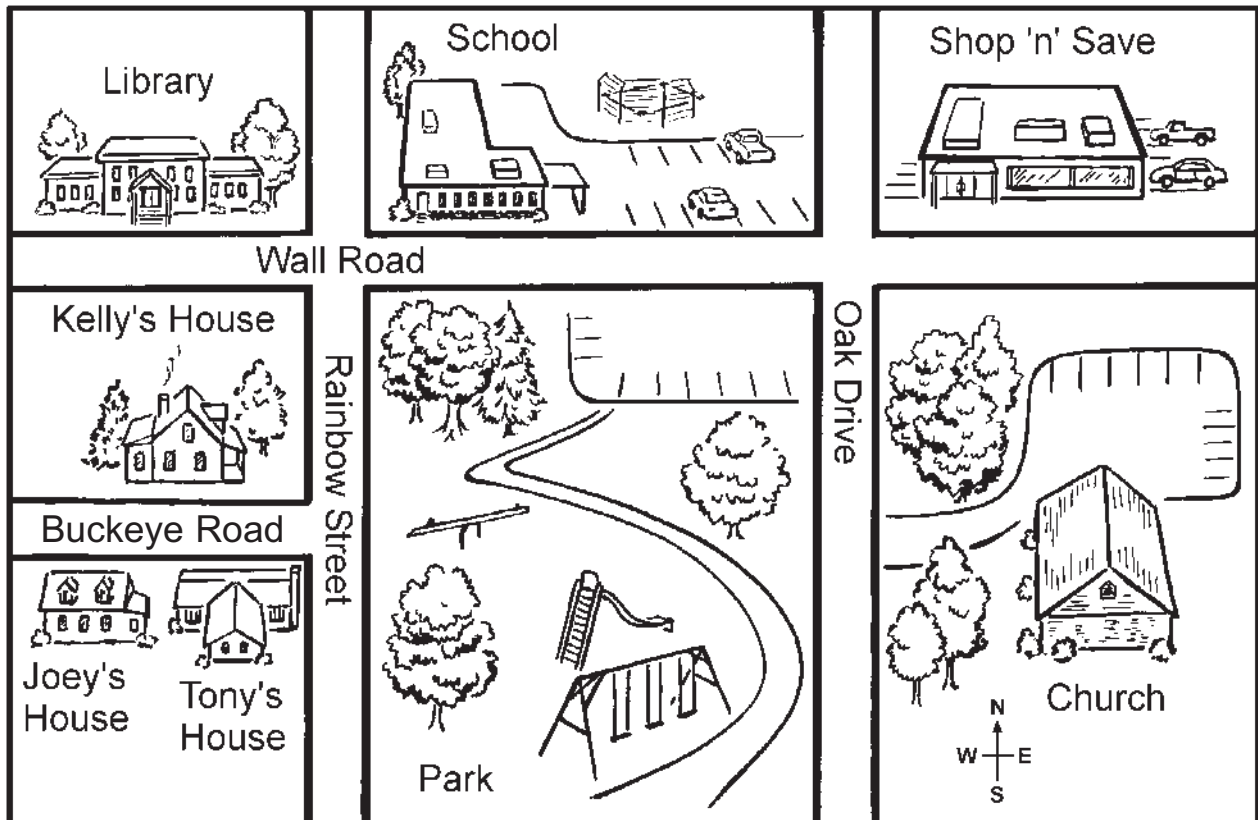
Lesson 6

Giving Directions

Suppose you need to tell someone how to get to your house from your church. What would you say? Being able to give good, clear directions is important.

Joey had invited Tony to go to church with him on Sunday. Tony's father came to Joey's house to ask for directions to the church. This is what Joey told him:

"Go east on Buckeye Road to Rainbow Street. Turn left and go north to Wall Road. Turn right and go one block to Oak Drive. Turn right. The brick church is on the left side of the road. The driveway is between four big oak trees."
