

Another way to show love to our neighbors is to **visit** with them.

Sometimes when Mom is hanging up the wash, Neighbor Sue comes over and talks to her. That is a short visit.



Sometimes you might go to the neighbor's house for the evening. That is a longer visit.

Neighbors can help us. They can give us **advice** when we have a problem.

One day Mom saw some bugs on the apple tree. Mom did not know what to do. Mom asked Neighbor Sue what to do. Neighbor Sue said, "I have some spray that will kill those bugs. You may use it." Mom sprayed it on. The bugs died. Mom thanked Neighbor Sue for the good advice.

Neighbors can tell each other important news too. We can tell our neighbors about Jesus. That is the most important news in the world!


Lesson 13

Godly Families

Do you know what a **godly** family is? It is a family that loves God. A godly family does what God tells them to do.

The Bible says, “Ye are the light of the world.” A godly family is like a light. A godly family loves and obeys God. You can be a light too. When you obey God, your neighbors can see you shining for Jesus.

Samaritan (sə•mār•ə•tən). Someone who lived in Samaria.


inn (ĭn). A place where travelers can spend the night.

The Good Samaritan

One day a man was traveling the mountain road from Jerusalem to Jericho. Some robbers were hiding beside the road. They grabbed the man and **wounded** him. They took his money and his clothes. Then they left him beside the road to die.

Soon a **priest** came by. But as soon as he saw the wounded man, he crossed to the other side of the road and hurried past. After a while a **Levite** came. He walked up to the wounded man and looked at him. Then he, too, went on his way.

Next a **Samaritan** came and saw the wounded man lying beside the road. He felt sorry for the man. He washed and bandaged the man's wounds. Then he picked up the man and set him on his own donkey. He took him to an **inn** and took care of him. The next morning he gave the innkeeper two coins and said, "Take care of this man until he is well again."



A godly family is like the Good Samaritan. They will stop and help their neighbors.
