As Christian Light grew in the 1980s, it encountered a rapidly growing homeschool movement which was serious about Christian education. As these families moved into challenging new territory, a special department was formed to help homeschooling parents succeed, especially those enrolled in our Homeschool Plus program. We are thankful for the opportunity to serve homeschoolers. This fictional story will give you a peek into our homeschool office and its interaction with others.

Before the counselors realize, the bell rings again. It is 5:00. Another day has passed in the Homeschool Department.






A SMALL CANDLE TO GUIDE ME



BIBLE VERSE MOTTOES Mary Currier




