

Writing Addresses

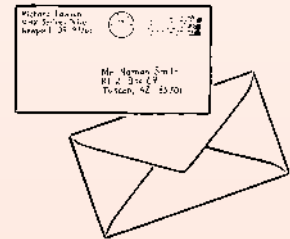
An address has three lines. The first line has the person's name. The second line has the house number and street name. The third line has the city, state or province, and zip code or postal code.

Remember every word in an address should be capitalized. Put a comma between the city and state.

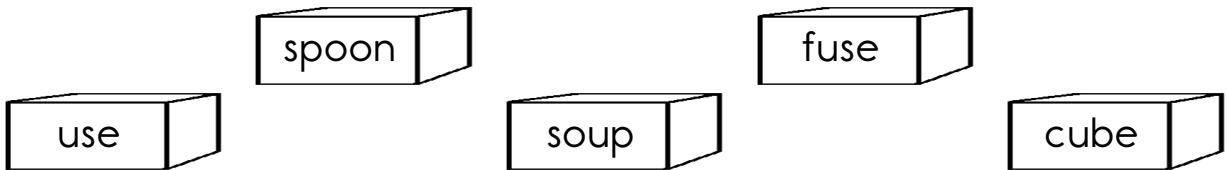

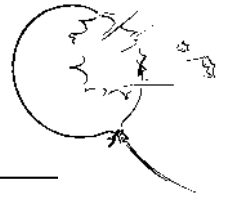

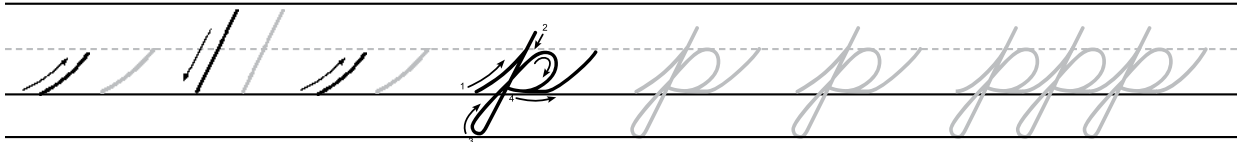
