Created in His Likeness

On the sixth day of Creation, God made a unique couple to crown His Creation and bring glory to Him. He stamped them with His image and likeness. He designed them for fellowship with Him. They would exercise **dominion** over the earth and take care of the beautiful planet God had created. God saw that everything He had made was very good, and He was deeply satisfied.

What does being in God's image and likeness mean? We know it can't be only that we have a face and hands; God also made us spiritual beings. How are we like God?

"Let us make man in our image, after our likeness."

Genesis 1:26

God is Spirit. He gave us each a spirit. We are more than physical bodies. When people choose integrity over money or value inner virtue over physical attractiveness, they show the image of God, who is Spirit.

God is holy. He made man holy and perfect. He made Adam and Eve flawless. They did not have a selfish, rebellious nature. When our lives are pure, we show the image of the Holy One.

God is almighty. God, who does as He wishes, also gave us free will to choose as we want. We have freedom to exercise self-control and to make choices for ourselves. Man's ability to choose between

obedience and disobedience or between honesty and cheating shows the image of God.

God is eternal. God, the I Am who always is, created us as immortal beings—once born, we will live forever. When people consider the long-term effects of a decision and deny themselves a temporal pleasure in favor of gaining eternal joy, they show the likeness of the eternal One.

God is three Persons. God, who fellowships with Himself, made us deeply social creatures. He gave us a desire for communication and fellowship. When you hug your mother or go to church or send a message to someone, you show the likeness of the Triune God.

God created us in His likeness to fellowship with Him. He yearned for creatures with whom He could share mutual love and friendship. When this happens, we spend time with each other; in fact, we *live* with each other. We learn to know Him, His will, His ways, and His thoughts. We become increasingly like Him. God desires this kind of fellowship far more than we can grasp.

Does God Need Man?

 but He does desire us.

God also created us for His glory. We glorify Him when we honor Him for who He is and what He does. We also glorify Him when our lives accurately represent Him. He glories in us when He sees Himself in us.

He delights in us when He sees us fulfilling His purposes and living according to His design.
