Directions to Ephrata Business Center

Southbound on I-81

Take 81 South to Rt. 78 East to Bethel, the exit for Rt. 501 South. Take this to 322 East. From the intersection of 501 South and 322 E, it will be approximately 7.3 miles to the Ephrata Business Center.

Northbound on I-81

Take 81 North to Harrisburg, PA. Get off at Exit 59 to take 581 East. In 7.7 miles, it turns into I-83 North. In 4.5 miles, take Exit 46B to put you on 322 East. Continue on this for 37 miles until you reach the Ephrata Business Center.
