## Note to the Teacher

The goal for Christian Light Education's Kindergarten program is to help prepare the student for Grade 1. The complete program has two levels, Kindergarten 1 and Kindergarten 2. These introduce children to elements of first grade and help prepare them to be successful when they start school. Kindergarten 1 targets four to five year-old children. Kindergarten 2 targets five to six year-olds.

## Kindergarten 2 - Sunrise Edition

Kindergarten 2 has five LittleLight Workbooks. They specifically prepare students to use CLE's Learning to Read program but may be used with any beginning reading program. They introduce the concepts of sounds, letters and numbers, letter writing, recognizing and writing numbers 1-100, and more. The goal is an introduction to sounds and numbers, but not necessarily mastery of phonics or math skills.

Kindergarten 2 also has five LittleLight Activity Books that include listening skills, matching, dot maps, identifying color names, sequence, same, different, shapes, and more. These also provide fun activities such as coloring, cutting, and pasting. Workbooks and Activity Books are done simultaneously-a lesson from each per day.

The Teacher's Guide gives detailed lesson instructions, including extra activities in motor skills, Bible memory, songs, poems, and stories. Reproductions of student pages with answers are included.

If you choose not to purchase the teacher's guide, use the instructions at the bottom of the workbook pages. They are directed to the teacher and occasionally give directions to be dictated to the children.

## Lesson 1

Roar, put-put, etc.


Twitter, chirp, etc.

Ask which things make sounds. Discuss the pictured items with the children and what sounds they make. Color the ones that make sounds. Pictures are cat, flower, tractor, and bird.


Ask where Sammy is playing. Sammy and sand begin with /s/. Draw a line from Sammy to each picture that begins with $/ \mathrm{s} /$. Put an $X$ on the other pictures. Pictures clockwise are sun, sandal, sack, moon, sock, sandwich, cat, scissors, fish, and suitcase.


Teach the correct way to form a circle. This is important for forming letters correctly in later lessons. Tell the children to trace the circles to help Sally blow bubbles. Start at the dot and follow the arrow.

Ponies should stay inside the fence. Keeping strokes inside the lines when writing is like keeping ponies inside the fence. Teach the correct method to make a line stroke from top to bottom. Remind children to make circles correctly. Children may color the picture, being careful to stay inside the lines.

Read: One night in Matthew's school room, a little gray mouse poked his head out of the closet. He was hungry. He wanted something to eat. He ran around the room sniffing at things. He tried to eat things that begin with $/ \mathrm{m} /$. Do you think Mr. Mouse got enough to eat that night?


Find and circle all the things that start with $/ \mathrm{m} /$. Remind of the correct way to make circles. Pictures to circle are magazine, monkey, microscope, mug, muffin, marbles, mouse, markers, macaroni, and marshmallows.


Top: Count how many wagons there are. Color the number 1 and the wagon.
Bottom: Trace and write the 1 . Use the number chart on page 55 and have the children count to 10 .


Ask where Sammy is walking with the wagon. Trace along the path with a red crayon. Sammy is taking his wagon down the path to pick up his toys. Put a 1 on each toy -1 ball, 1 car, 1 boat, and 1 shovel with the red crayon.


Top: There are 4 boys and each boy needs a ball. Draw 1 ball for each boy. Draw a line from each boy to his ball. Bottom: Draw a line from the numbers to the pictures. Teach children how to use a short ruler to draw straight lines for matching.


Count the toys and circle how many.

## Lesson 2



Top: Name the pictures and listen for the /d/ sound. If /d/ is heard, draw a line from the picture to Dd in the middle. Put an $X$ on the other pictures. Pictures are domino, desk, dove, fish, donut, doll, and sun. Bottom: Children help the animals get home by tracing the dotted lines from left to right.

Top: Duck begins with /d/. Color the duck. Middle: With a pencil lightly write the child's first name on the line. Have the child trace his name. Bottom: Trace and write the d.


Children help the duck get to the pond by following only the d's. Say /d/ as they cross over each d.

If /d/ is heard, write $\mathbf{d}$. If not, put an $X$ on the picture. Pictures are doll, donut, sandwich, mouse, domino, and doctor.


Top: Count how many train engines. Color the number 2 and the engines. Bottom: Trace and write the 2. Use the number chart on page 55 and have the children count to 10.


Top and Middle: Count the pictures. Trace the 1,2,3 on the train and the ducks.
Bottom: Match by drawing lines from each group of pictures to the number.


Count the pictures and circle how many.


Top: Children help Sammy put his toys away by reading the numbers on the toys.
Bottom: Circle the correct number of animals in each row.

## Lesson 3



Sammy enjoys playing at the seashore. Find and circle the $\mathbf{S}$ and $\mathbf{s}$. Find and name 13 things that start with the /s/ sound. Pictures are sea, seashell, sand, sun, sign, sandals, sunglasses, sandwich, socks, sombrero, sand castle, sailboat, and seven.

Top: Circle the letter for each picture. Pictures are sun, dog, doll, door, scissors, and sock.
Bottom: Draw a line between capital and lowercase letters. Draw a sun. Ask what sound the sun starts with. (/s/) Color the sun yellow.
