



Directions: The dotted lines should be traced from left to right with pencil and then with crayon. Child should stop but not lift pencil at the corners.

Discussion: Arctic terns fly high above the mountains. Polar bears walk and climb in snowy places. Seals slide on the ice and swim in the cold water.




Directions: The dotted lines should be traced (with pencil and then with crayon) from the terns down to the fish and back up, and from the seals to the bottom.

Discussion: Arctic terns dive to catch fish with their bills. Weddell seals dive very, very deep in the water to find food. They often dive under the ice.




Directions: The crayons in the instructions on pages 4 and 5 should be colored correctly before tracing the dotted shapes and coloring the objects.

Discussion: Can child think of other objects with the same shapes? Circles shown: cherries, balls, balloon. Squares shown: pillow, book, birdhouse, gift.



Directions: The crayons in the instructions on pages 4, 5, and 6 introduce the eight basic colors and could be used as reference as needed throughout this book.

Discussion: Can child think of other objects with these shapes? Triangles shown: kite, tepee (Indian tent). Rectangles shown: highway sign, brick house.



Directions: Child should color the crayons in the instructions and then trace the dotted outlines of the shapes before coloring the objects.

Discussion: Can child find other basic shapes in his toys or in his surroundings? Examples: square blocks, round wheels, rectangular books and tables.
