

Job: A Godly Man

Job 1:6-12, 14, 15, 18-22

- 6. Now there was a day when the sons of God came to present themselves before the LORD, and Satan came also among them.
- 7. And the LORD said unto Satan, Whence comest thou? Then Satan answered the LORD, and said, From going to and fro in the earth, and from walking up and down in it.
- 8. And the LORD said unto Satan, Hast thou considered my servant Job, that there is none like him in the earth, a perfect and an upright man, one that feareth God, and escheweth evil?
- 9. Then Satan answered the LORD, and said, Doth Job fear God for nought?
- 10. Hast not thou made an hedge about him, and about his house, and about all that he hath on every side? thou hast blessed the work of his hands, and his substance is increased in the land.
- 11. But put forth thine hand now, and touch all that he hath, and he will curse thee to thy face.

Lesson Story

Job lived in the land of Uz. He was a good man who hated evil. He served the Lord.


Last of all a servant came and said, "When your sons and daughters were all together, a great wind blew down the house. All of them were killed."

Teacher's Guide

To the Teacher

Worship: does God deserve it? Definitely! "Give unto the LORD the glory due unto his name; worship the LORD in the beauty of holiness" (Psalm 29:2).

Wisdom: do you need it? "If any of you [teachers] lack wisdom, let him ask of God, that giveth to all men liberally, and upbraideth not; and it shall be given him" (James 1:5).

All the lessons except Lesson 13 draw from the *Wisdom Literature* section of the Bible—Job, Psalms, and Proverbs. As you lead your pupils through these lessons, may you worship God and learn wisdom.

Many of the Scripture texts come from Psalms and Proverbs; therefore, they do not have a Bible story as such. Usually, we have included a story following the text.

Tips for Teachers

Here are some specific suggestions and explanations for the various parts of the lesson.

Introducing the Lesson: You will find several ideas in each lesson for a point of contact. Use one or more in your introduction, or incorporate them elsewhere in the lesson. Feel free to use your own ideas.

To Do at Home: These activities give the child something to do at home to familiarize himself with some of the ideas of the lesson.

To Do in Class: Do these activities in class. Younger members will likely need some help in reading. Help with writing answers as needed.

Teaching the Lesson: This is a general guide regarding the order in which you could proceed. Feel free to adjust and adapt. You will need to decide at what point in the lesson to have prayer, use the teaching picture, say the memory work, and sing.

Teaching Picture: You may wish to hold up the picture as you tell the story; then place it on a bulletin board or wall to use for reviewing in later lessons.

Memory Verse: The memory verses are relatively short and simple, so you can expect your students to say them well. You will find all the verses for the quarter listed inside the front cover. This page may be photocopied and sent home to post as a handy reference for learning the verses for each Sunday. The sheet may be trimmed and pasted onto a sheet of colored construction paper before it is sent home.

Singing: Singing is important to children. The song selections given are only suggestions. Those with numbers are from *Praises We Sing*, available from Christian Light Publications. Feel free to pick your own songs and to ask the pupils for their favorites.

Additional Activities in Class: Use these activities near the end of the class period or at any convenient place in the lesson.

Background Scripture: Job 1

Lesson Aims

- 1. To admire the character qualities of Job.
- 2. To observe the trouble caused by Satan in Job's experience.
- 3. To bless God in times of financial reverses.

Teacher Meditation

A magnificent diamond found in a mine in Africa was given to the King of England. The king sent the priceless jewel to a gem specialist for refining. For weeks the skillful man studied the gem, making drawings and models of its quality, flaws, and content. Knowing the gem thoroughly, the craftsman cut a nick in the diamond and struck a mighty blow which broke the jewel in two. No, it was not ruined! Instead, two gems of magnificent quality were the result.

You and I lie in the skilled Craftsman's hand. He knows us through and through. Whatever blows He permits, we can be assured He knows what He's doing for our own growth and spiritual enrichment. "The hand of the LORD hath wrought this" (Job 12:9).

Introducing the Lesson

Tell about a tornado or windstorm (if possible, one the pupils know about).

- *Or*, draw stick figures on the chalkboard to show the number of sons (seven) and daughters (three) Job had. One day they were all killed. How and why did it happen? Listen to the Bible story to find out.
- *Or*, bring pictures of the types of animals Job owned. Job 1:3 tells of sheep, camels, oxen, and she asses.
- *Or*, begin something like this: Suppose that all in one day a drunk driver ran into your daddy's car, wrecking it beyond repair. Your mother, brother, and sister were hurt badly in the wreck and were in the hospital. Then that night lightning struck your house and it burned down. How would you and your family feel? What question might you ask the Lord? (Why?) In our lesson today some terrible things happened to Job. Let's see what they were.
- *Or*, write *job* on the chalkboard. Get a pupil to read it. Now write *Job* and note the different pronunciation.

Teaching the Lesson

Introduce the lesson.

Tell or read the Bible story.

As a little review of the Bible story, do the exercise *Choose the Best*.

Discuss what sort of man Job was.

Read these words one by one, calling on pupils to decide whether or not they fit Job.

Discuss what Satan did in hopes of making Job turn away from God. Use the exercise *Bible People Who Were Tempted* to expand the theme of temptation. Tell about the temptations those Bible characters faced.

Discuss how Job could still bless and praise God despite all the cruel losses he suffered. Promote gratitude and blessing God as you help the pupils do *The Lord Gave*.

Job Faces More Trouble

Background Scripture: Job 2-4, 42

Lesson Aims

- 1. To learn how to comfort those in trouble.
- 2. To trust God in times of illness and adversity.
- 3. To pray for others.

Teacher Meditation

A baby suffers stomach pains. A child suffers rejection of school friends. Adults at times experience misunderstandings. We may lose a job, friends, houses, or lands.

Though we may never experience the intensity of Job's suffering, we will likely encounter suffering at some time. Through suffering, we come to the end of ourselves and learn to rely on the power of God. Our faith is strengthened by knowing God.

Job is an outstanding example of faithfulness. His suffering did not cause him to abandon God. His suffering drew him nearer to God, causing him to develop a closer relationship to God.

In today's lesson we see Job understanding God's ways better. Because of his faithfulness, God rewards Job with twice the riches he had before. God may not reward us with material things, but as we submit to what He teaches
