Grammar Notes

The *v* and *b* in Spanish are usually pronounced softer than in English, without vibration of the teeth on the lips. For practice, close your lips very gently and say *bebé* without any popping sound, as if you were softly saying *vevé*. (*bebé* = baby).

In some Central American countries the *b* and *v* are pronounced so interchangeably that the listener cannot decipher which one is being said without knowing the spelling of the word.
