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Solving Systems of Equations by **Multiplication/Addition**

Solving systems of equations by the addition/elimination method works only if the x or y variables have coefficients that are opposite or can be made opposites by multiplying one of the equations by -1.

To solve equations when the coefficients are not opposites or cannot be made opposites requires multiplying one or both of the equations by a factor or factors that make the coefficients opposite. In Example 1 below, multiplying the second equation by 2 makes the coefficients opposites.

Example 1 Solve the system: 3x - 4y = -37 and x + 2y = 1.

A.
$$3x - 4y = -37$$
 Original system.

B.
$$x + 2y = 1$$

B.
$$x + 2y = 1$$
 Multiply equation B by 2, changing 2y to 4y. $2[x + 2y = 1]$

$$3x - 4y = -37$$

2x + 4y = 2

Add the transformed equation B to equation A to eliminate the *y* terms.

B. (+)
$$2x + 4y = 2$$

$$5x = -35$$

 $\frac{5x}{5} = \frac{-35}{5}$ Solve the resulting equation for x.

$$x = -7$$

$$-7 + 2y = 1$$

Substitute the value of *x* into one of the original equations and solve it for y. (Equation B is used.)

$$\frac{2y}{2} = \frac{8}{2}$$

y = 4

(-7, 4)Ordered-pair solution.

$$3(-7) - 4(4) = -37$$

Since equation B was used to find y, substitute the solution into equation A.

$$-21 - 16 = -37$$

When one of the coefficients is not a multiple of the other, both equations must be multiplied by the appropriate factors to achieve opposite coefficients.

Example 2 Solve the system: 2x - 3y = -11 and 3x + 4y = 9.

A.
$$2x - 3y = -11$$
 Original system. Neither the *x*, nor the *y* coeffi-

B.
$$3x + 4y = 9$$
 cients are multiples of the other, so both equations must be multiplied to get opposite coefficients.

A.
$$4[2x - 3y = -11]$$
 Equation A multiplied by 4 to get a coefficient $8x - 12y = -44$ of -12 .

B.
$$3[3x + 4y = 9]$$
 Equation B multiplied by 3 to get a coefficient $9x + 12y = 27$

$$8x - 12y = -44$$
 The transformed equations added.

B.
$$(+)$$
 $9x + 12y = 27$ $17x = -17$

x = -1 Resulting equation solved for x.

$$2(-1) - 3y = -11$$
 Substitute the value of x into one of the original equations and solve it for y . (Equation A is used.)
$$-3y = -9$$

$$y = 3$$

$$(-1, 3)$$
 The solution to the system is the ordered-pair $(-1, 3)$.

Sometimes the coefficients of the terms in a system of equations are not opposites. When this happens, both sides of one of the equations must be multiplied by a negative factor.

Any of the methods taught in this course can be used to solve a system of equations. Each method will produce the same solution, but one may be simpler for a given situation. Proficiency in each method makes it easier to determine which method works best for a specific problem.

Example 3 on the next page shows solving a system of equations when both equations must be multiplied by appropriate factors.

Solve the system: 2x + 3y = -15 and 5x + 2y = 1.

$$2x + 3y = -15$$
 Original system.

B.
$$5x + 2y = 1$$

$$5[2x + 3y = -15]$$
 Multiply equation A by 5 to get a coefficient of

$$-2[5x + 2y = 1]$$
 10x. Multiply equation B by -2 to get a coefficient of $-10x$.

 Solve the resulting equation for *y*.

 Substitute the value of *y* into one of the original $2x - 21 = -15$ equations and solve it for *x*. (Equation A is used.)

$$2x = 6$$
$$x = 3$$

y = -7

) The solution to the system is the ordered pair (3, -7).
