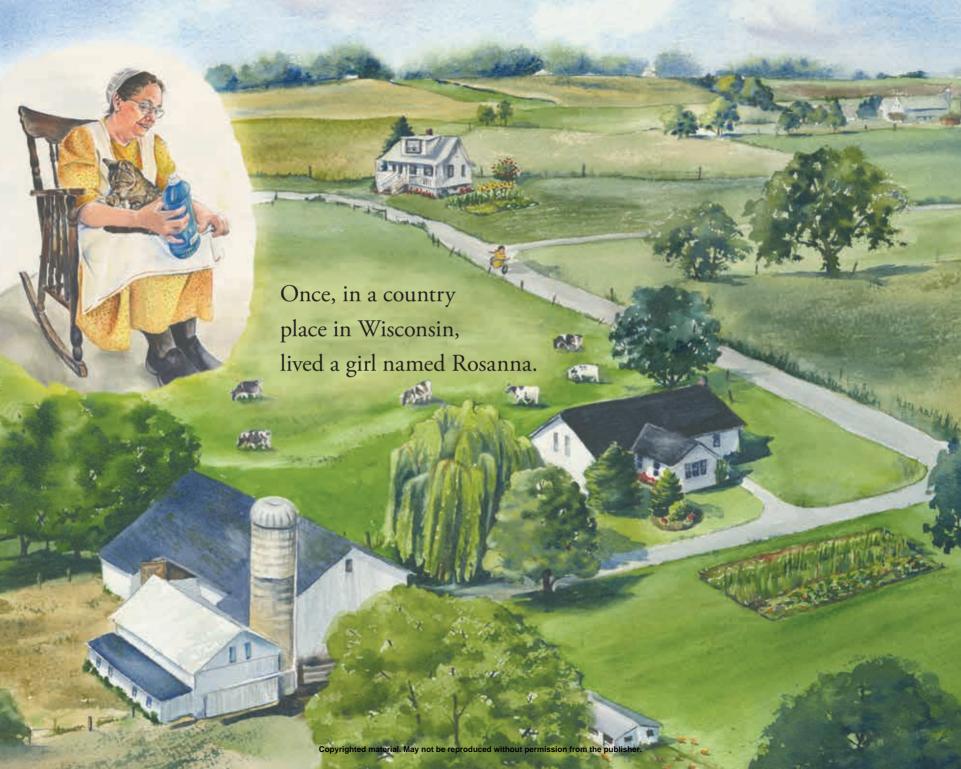


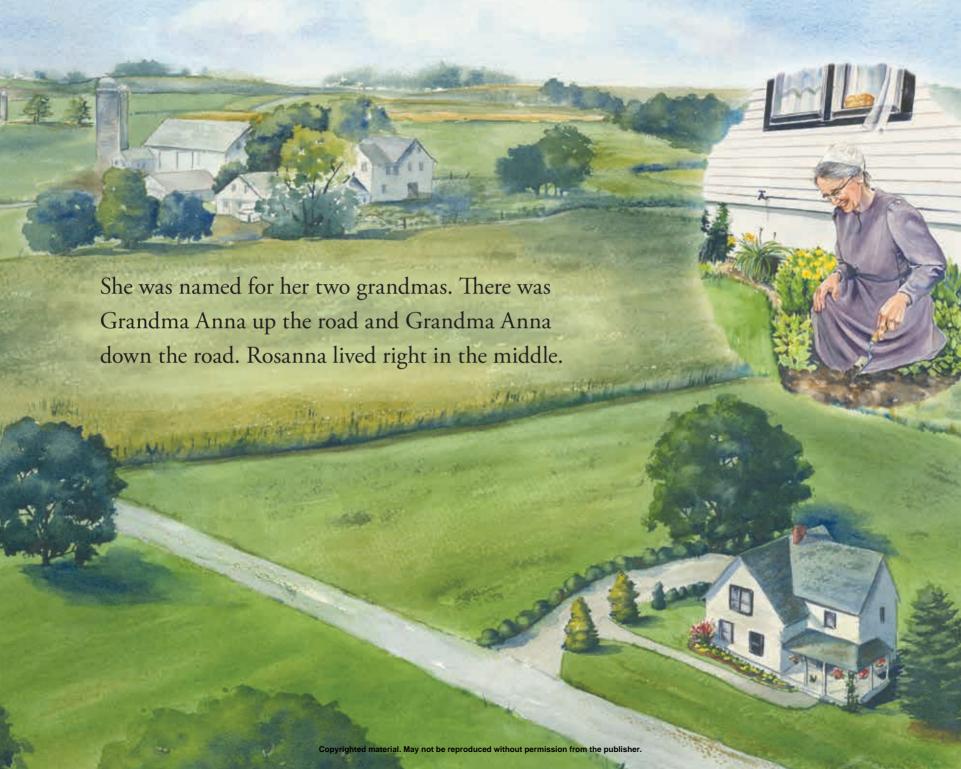
AUTHOR'S NOTE
