






OCTAVIO SOLIS is a playwright and director living in San Francisco. His works Se Llama Cristina, John Steinbeck's The Pastures of Heaven, Ghosts of the River, Quixote, Lydia, June in a Box, Lethe, Marfa Lights, Gibraltar, The Ballad of Pancho and Lucy, The 7 Visions of Encarnación, Bethlehem, Dreamlandia, El Otro.Man of the Flesh, Prospect, El Paso Blue, Santos & Santos, and La Posada Mágica have been mounted at the California Shakespeare Theatre, Mark Taper Forum, Yale Repertory Theatre, the Oregon Shakespeare Festival, the Denver Center for the Performing Arts, the Dallas Theater Center, the Magic Theatre, Intersection for the Arts, South Coast Repertory Theatre, the San Diego Repertory Theatre, the San Jose Repertory Theatre, Shadowlight Productions, the Venture Theatre in Philadelphia, Latino Chicago Theatre Company, Boston Court and Kitchen Dog Theatre, the New York Summer Play Festival, Teatro Vista in Chicago, El Teatro Campesino, the Undermain Theatre in Dallas, Thick Description, Campo Santo, the Imua Theatre Company in New York, and Cornerstone Theatre. His collaborative works includeCloudlands, with Music by Adam Gwon, Burning Dreams, cowritten with Julie Hebert and Gina Leishman and Shiner, written with Erik Ehn. He is the recipient of the 2000-2001 National Theatre Artists Residency Grant from TCG and the Pew Charitable Trust. He has also just been awarded a United States Artists Fellowship for 20012. Solis is a Thornton Wilder Fellow for the MacDowell Colony, New Dramatists alum and member of the Dramatists Guild. His new anthology, "The River Plays" has been published by NoPassPort Publishing. He is working on commissions for the Magic Theatre SF and Yale Repertory Theatre.

She is the Director of Production Design for Tides Theatre.

SALLY DANA (Casting Director) joined Tides Theatre as a company member and casting director after playing the role of Regina in The Little Foxes. Sally has been performing as an actor, singer, drummer and voiceover artist for over 25 years. Originally from Seattle, Sally received her Theatre training from Seattle's Cornish College of the Arts. He has toured the U.S. numerous times and scored more than a



He's won the Investigative Reporters and Editors award and the Society of Professional Journalists Sigma Delta Chi award for online investigative reporting. Under Andrew's watch, VOSD won the Online News Association's General Excellence Award and was named the urban innovation leader for California by Fast Company magazine. In San Diego, he also wrote and appeared in weekly segments with NBC San Diego and co-hosted a weekly public affairs radio program. He was a 2012-13 John S. A StoryWorks original play in response to The Center for Investigative Reporting report

"The Dark Side of the Strawberry"

On November 10, 2014, The Center for Investigative Reporting (CIR) published "The Dark Side of the Strawberry"— a multiplatform investigative series (cironline.org/strawberries) revealing that state regulators have allowed dangerous pesticides to be used in amounts their own scientists say increase cancer risks.

The year-long investigation features text stories, an animated history of the modern strawberry narrated by Roman Mars, host and producer of the public radio show 99% Invisible, and the first searchable data map ever designed for the public with detailed, comprehensive data about each of the 20 million permitted pesticide applications in California during the last 10 years.

CIR reported that California's \$2.6 billion strawberry industry relies on a class of pesticides called fumigants, which have been linked to cancer, developmental problems and ozone depletion.

Even before the story broke, the Department of Pesticide Regulation changed some of their enforcement policies in response to the public records requests CIR filed.

On January 14, 2015, California passed regulations stricter than those mandated by the Environmental Protection Agency to limit the use of a leading fumigant used to grow California strawberries. Although CIR cannot take credit for these specific regulations, the pressure CIR reporting put on the State to act by bringing this issue to the attention of the public did not go unnoticed.
