I wrote Boxer + Brown.

Last week I wrote President Bush as the PWA group wants to ovalize him with mail.

I mentioned several points

- 1) People of Color are at greatest risk
- 2) 500,000 Californians at least are HIV+
- 3) 3800 teenagers in Ca. are +
- 4) Drugs that are safe

CD4 (Peptide T) and Passive Immune Rx are being withheld while we die of negligent genocide.

Keep me informed. I can't send money as the IRS + medications have me bankrupt.

The Vigil

★ As people with AIDS and ARC, we have led a delegation to Washington, D.C. representing the ARC/AIDS Vigil. The Vigil is a civil rights and awareness action that has been active at UN Plaza in San Francisco since Oct. 28, 1985. During this trip we made the Four Moral Appeals of the Vigil, supported by an extensive information packet we have developed. Our primary purpose was to convey the human dimensions of this crisis by sharing the direct experience of our own lives. Most of all we want to help reawaken in the American people their true spirit of compassion, understanding and love.

We have directly shared in the hard work of developing this project over the past six weeks, and were all duly elected as delegates by democratic ballots of the Vigil Family. We believe that our leadership role as legitimate representatives of the Vigil is important for the many other people with ARC or AIDS who have been too often denied a direct leadership role in forming America's response to this tragic epidemic.

Our delegation has had generous assistance from several important bodies, including Mobilization Against AIDS, the San Francisco Labor Council and the National Gay Task Force. We have received valuable individual assistance from staff of the San Francisco AIDS Foundation, and from leaders such as Sen. Alan Cranston, Rep. Barbara Boxer, Rep. Sala Burton, Mayor Diane Feinstein, and State Senator Milton Marks. San Francisco Supervisor John Molinari has been especially helpful.

As representatives of one among several AIDS advocacy organizations, we welcome support and suggestions. We do not welcome attempts to distort or politicize this common effort—whether they are motivated by competition, jealousy or by media hype.

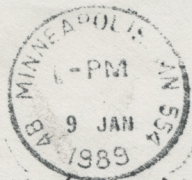
