ABOUT THE ARTISTS

SCOTT FOGLESONG: A native of Houston, Texas, Scott began his piano study at the age of four. He received his training at the Peabody Conservatory of Music in Baltimore, where he studied piano with Elizabeth Katzenellenbogen and Konrad Wolff, theory with John Carton and Earle Brown, and the San Francisco Conservatory of Music, where he studied piano with Beatrice Beauregard and Nathan Schwartz, and harpsichord with Laurette Goldberg. Mr. Foglesong holds both his bachelor's and masters degrees from the San Francisco Conservatory of Music.

Mr. Foglesong has concertized throughout the United States, and has appeared regularly on Bay Area radio, as well as being featured on five recordings. A former member of the Amor Musica Chamber Players, he has played with the New Music Ensemble, The Berkeley Contemporary Music Ensemble, the San Francisco Chamber Orchestra, as well as being a featured soloist on World Explorer Cruises since 1985.

He is currently a member of the San Francisco Conservatory faculty, where he is a full-time instructor of musicianship in the Collegiate division and piano in the Preparatory and Extension divisions.

PAUL G. McNABB: A native of Washington, D.C., Paul received his Bachelor's degree from the San Francisco Conservatory of Music studying with Bonnie Hampton. After beginning his cello studies at the age of fifteen with Ruth Thomas of the Annapolis Symphony, Paul studied with Robert Newkirk, Robert Ashby, Leopold Teraspulsky, Irene Sharp, and Einar "Jeff" Holm. He has attended the Musi-corda Summer Arts Festival, the Meadowmount School of Music and the CSU Summer Arts Festival at CSU Humboldt, where he was selected as the cellist for the festival trio. Paul has participated in master classes with Charles Wendt, Einar "Jeff" Holm, Steven Doane, and Jeff Mann of West Germany. Currently, Paul is an active chamber musician and orchestral player in the San Francisco Greater Bay Area.

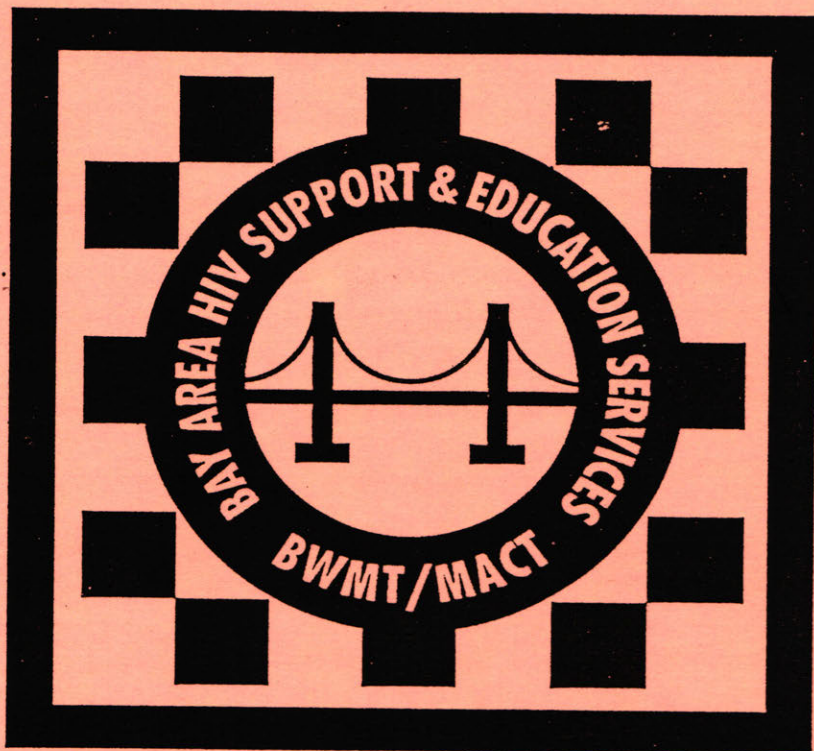

On behalf of the agency, our clients and all those living with HIV, thank you for your support and contributions. A special thanks to the cast for their time, energy, and talents.

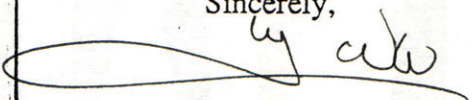

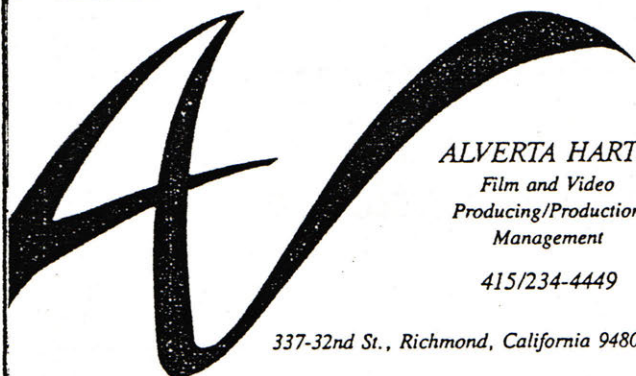

BAHSES HIV SUPPORT SERVICES

BAHSES' HIV Support Services program offers a variety of services ranging from support groups to transportation support.

Our HIV Survival Support program is a 25+ week program for people with HIV to work through their HIV/AIDS issues and develop an action plan for positive living. Module I (10 weeks) deals with feelings about HIV and emotional issues surrounding HIV. Module II (15 weeks) is a more structured section that deals with such topics as relationships, treatment information and holistic life planning. Module III is client directed and has no time frame.

Our Transportation support program offers bus tokens and taxi vouchers to assist persons with HIV/AIDS in getting to their doctor's appointment, picking up medications, attending support group meetings, and other medical appointments.

January 27, 1992

Attendees: Marlon Vera, Lee Woo, Michael Brunetti, Don Pharaoh, Margarita Benitez, Thomas Hajjar, Phyllis Jean Jackson

1. Discussion centered around what event would be appropriate and would develop the platform for collaboration for both organizations.

The outcome of the event would be:

1. Raise money for both organizations
2. Create additional media exposure for the Center and assist with BAHSES' visibility in the East Bay.
3. Develop closer working relationship between the two agencies.
4. Improve the availability of services to agency clients.

2. Don Pharaoh put forth two fundraising ideas:

- a. Fish Fry - to be held on the weekend of May 16/17

The Center had a fish fry in 1990 and was able to raise \$10,000. With this history, this would be an event that has a track record and is a proven fundraiser. This fundraiser would be easy to do since does not take much in planning and execution. It is recommended that an event coordinator be found or hired. This will be worked out in future meetings. The coordinator would be paid by a corporate donor or event sponsors.

- b. East Bay Gay Day and evening event.

This will require other East Bay Community organizations participation to make this event successful. The evening event will take place the next day and would be a joint fund raiser for both agencies. It was noted that this event would take a lot of planning starting a year from the scheduled date.

3. The number of meetings to develop the fundraiser was discussed. The descision was to meet two times per month until the project was off the ground.

4. It was noted this was a joint board project of the two agencies BAHSES and The Center. Paid staff would be restricted to administrative support and not necessarily participation on this joint committee. The respective boards are to ensure enough members on the joint committee.

5. The needs of appointing Co-Chairs was suggested. Marlon would represent The Center and BAHSES would name the other Co-Chair from its board before the next meeting.

ACTION: BAHSES Board to appoint a Co-Chair.

6. The following action items are to be completed before the next meeting:

- a. Contact last years fish fry chef

- b. Contact a potential chef for this year fish fry

ACTION: Lee

c. Budget for the fundraiser to be developed. Last fish fry budget to be made available to Mike Brunetti

ACTION: Mike to develop budget

d. Locate possible gospel groups to perform.

ACTION: Phyllis Jean Jackson

e. Locate possible site.

ACTION: Marlon

f. Check out the cost of a tent.

ACTION: Thomas

g. Select a board member from BAHSES to serve as Joint Committee Co-Chair.
