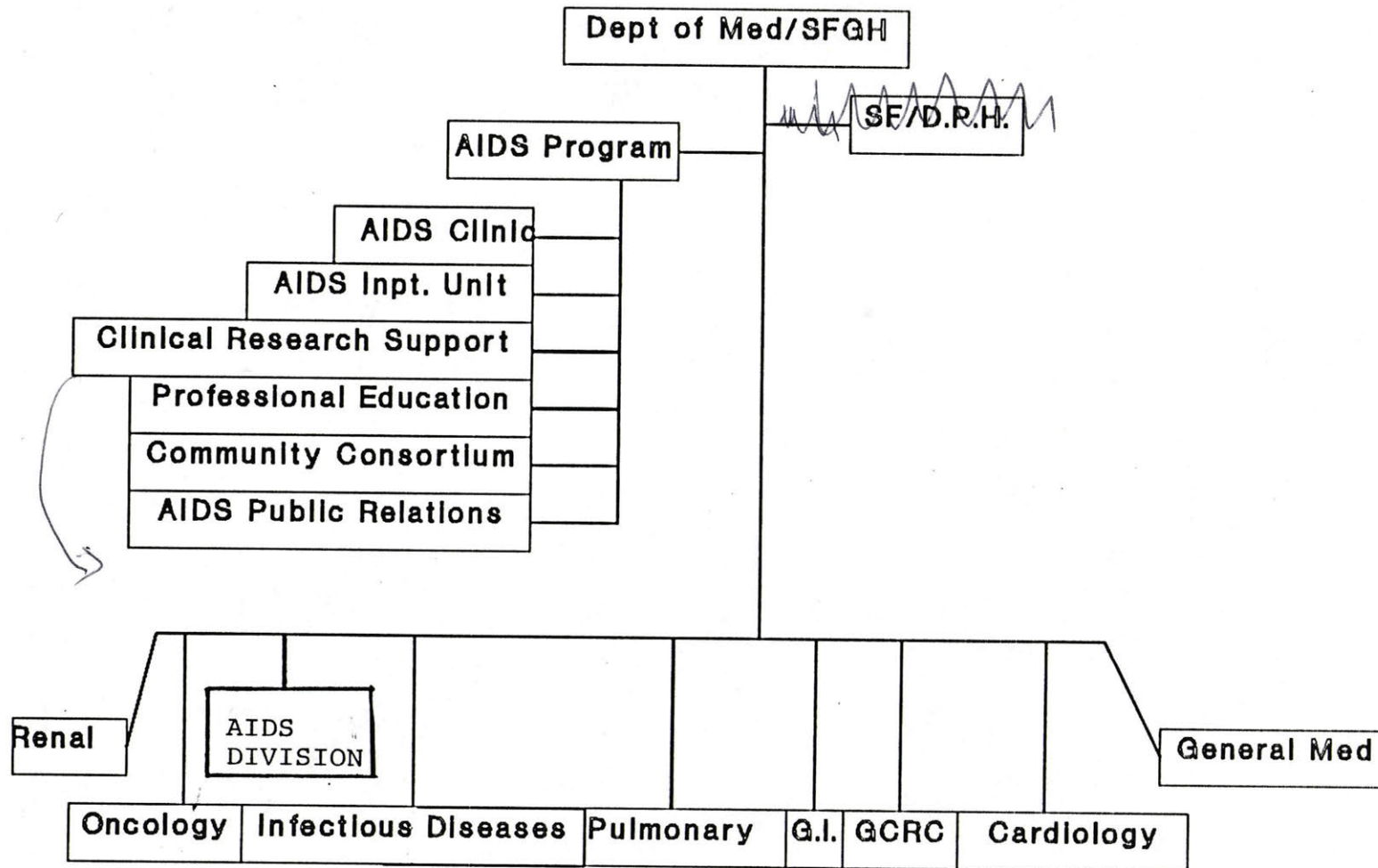


AIDS PROGRAM ORGANIZATION



GUIDELINES FOR NEW SYSTEM

AIDS Division renamed AIDS Program, but retains divisional administrative academic and administration functions.

AIDS Program provides support services for clinical research

AIDS Program has access to research activities and support data from Divisions. *and maintains R/P of all AIDS related grant proposals*

AIDS Program reviews all relevant contracts and grants and ~~signs off along~~ with the Dept. of Medicine ~~& maintains file of all relevant grants.~~

AIDS Program continues to operate AIDS clinic and general AIDS inpatient consultations

AIDS Program expected to communicate research opportunities to relevant Division, *and to facilitate AIDS research activities in Divisions.*

Offer assistance in trial design, data collection.

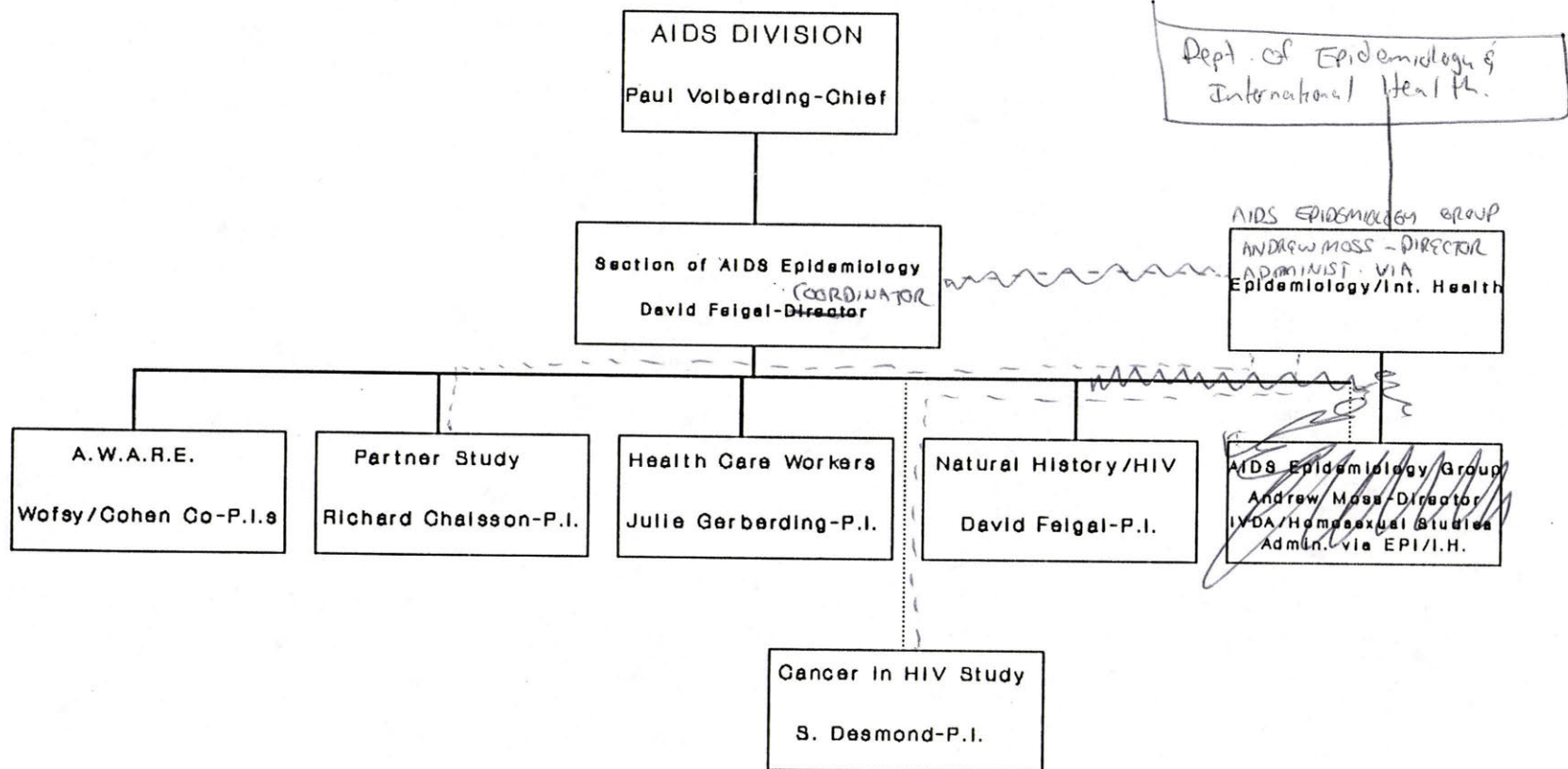
II. Provide complete information to Dept. of Medicine

SFGH SECTION OF AIDS EPIDEMIOLOGY

Structure and Responsibilities

Section is part of AIDS Division:

Division chief responsible for evaluation of component performance, academic review and promotion, space assignment

Division administrator responsible for final budget review, shared cost assessments, ledgers, personnel activities (timesheets, benefits etc.)

Section is ^{coordinated} ~~directed~~ by David Feigal:

Facilitate communication, collaboration through shared resources (computer etc.)

Provide overall administrative support and linkage with AIDS Division administrative staff

SFGH SECTION OF AIDS EPIDEMIOLOGY

Section accepts relative autonomy of individual projects
Moss will serve as Director of the AIDS Epidemiology
Group (Homosexual men and IVDA studies) which will
be a project of the Dept. of Epidemiology and Int.
Health, with ^{additional} support (clinic space, shared personnel)
from the AIDS Activities Division. This group will
be administered by staff hired by Dr. Moss ⁱⁿ the
Dept. of Epidemiology/Int. Health ^{through.}

Section will interact with Epidemiology Consortium
(Winkelstein)

Section will be assigned discrete space and any use of
additional space will be negotiated by the AIDS
Division through the Department of Medicine and the
Hospital.
