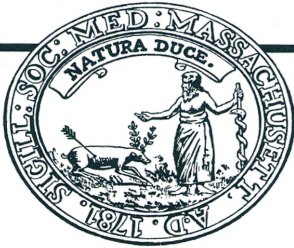
1. To really hone in on the Ascertainment report and the direction for the Communications effort under Jim Bunn's direction, and

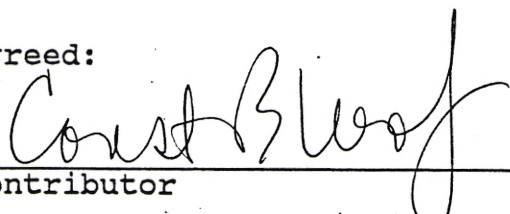
