



SUGGESTED GOALS FOR 4-H CLUB SEALS



A 4-H Club may earn a seal by meeting the requirements for a 4-H Club charter, having the Secretary's Book completely filled out, and by successfully achieving goals set and approved by the club at the beginning of the club year.

Counties may help set guidelines for minimum goals, emphasizing county-wide 4-H program goals. However, clubs are encouraged to develop goals most appropriate to their local situations.

A program planning committee of club members working with an adult leader will set the goals for the club for the coming year, particularly considering the accomplishments of the previous year. After club members approve the goals, the club secretary will send a copy of goals selected to the county office and, if possible, make copies available to all club members.

At the end of the year, club officers and the leader will submit a report of goals achieved to the county office.

To achieve seal recognition, a club must:

- Meet requirements for charter—
 - ▲ Have five or more members enrolled
 - ▲ Have at least one adult leader
 - ▲ Be organized with club officers
 - ▲ Submit a written program of work for the year to the county Extension office.
- Completely fill out Secretary's Book.
- Meet the requirements set locally.
