To train leaders to help members complete their 4-H record books.

TEACHING PLAN (METHODS) FOR COMING YEAR

Learning experiences to be provided — activities-events (include timing)

1. Meet with parents, leaders, and interested citizens in each of these problem areas and outline the needs of the 4-H club, as well as the qualifications for leaders. Then encourage this group to choose their own leaders.
2. Involve at least one leader from each club on a 4-H Council Committee. Encourage representation from every club at these meetings.
3. Have the leaders decide the type of training they would like, and the best time for it. Then, use key leaders to help conduct some of the training.
