TO MADERA COUNTY FOOTHILL RANCHERS:

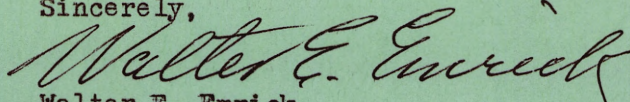
NOW is the best time of the year to kill those old Bull pines on your range land that are robbing your grass and springs of water and your cattle of feed.
