Voting in the Beef Checkoff Referendum is a whole lot easier than the job Emil faces.



If you can make it to your County Extension office on May 10, then you can vote in person.

If not, then you can vote by absentee ballot. How?

It's easy! Simply complete the enclosed absentee ballot request card and drop it in the mail today; it's already addressed and stamped. An absentee ballot and registration form will be mailed to you promptly. All you will need to do is fill out the ballot and registration form and return them to your County Extension office in the pre-addressed envelope that will be provided to you. Remember to put a stamp on the envelope.

Your absentee ballot must be in by May 3. So return the enclosed card today and mail your ballot by April 25 to be sure it gets counted.

Is there more than one person in your family who has owned their own cattle between October 1, 1986 and March 31, 1988? Then they are also eligible to vote and can obtain an absentee ballot. How?

By obtaining an absentee ballot request card from the local Cattlemen's or CattleWomen's unit, County Extension office or County Farm Bureau office. Or, by requesting a card from the Beef Referendum Information Committee, P.O. 7546, San Mateo, CA 94403, (415) 598-2612. Or, if they want, they can get an absentee ballot by writing directly to Cooperative Extension - Beef Referendum, University of California, Davis, CA 95616.

The Beef Referendum is your opportunity to determine if checkoff-funded programs will continue. Every vote is important, so be sure that yours gets counted.
