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Mariposa County 4-H "Camp Tweety"

On May 21-23, 2004, 4-H 'Camp Tweety' will take place at Camp Sugar Pine in Oakhurst. This camp is co-sponsored by Yosemite Bank, County Bank, and the Mariposa County Soroptomist club along with the Mariposa County 4-H. The camp will begin Friday evening and end on Sunday around noon. Camp Sugar Pine adds a little excitement to camping with activities such as fishing, ping-pong, air-hockey, paddle boats, and swimming (weather permitting). Along with these activities the campers will have educational workshops, arts & crafts, campfires, and more.

Mariposa County 4-H Youth Development Program invites all 4th, 5th, & 6th grade children to come join the fun at Camp Tweety. Youth need to be age 9 by January 1, 2004. 4-H members and friends from Mariposa and surrounding counties are invited. The registration fee is \$75.00 for 4-H members. For non-4-Hers, an additional \$6.00 fee, for insurance, will apply. The fee includes two nights lodging, (5) meals, snacks, materials, and a camp souvenir. Registration forms are now available at 4-H club meetings, elementary schools, Mariposa County Library, and at the UCCE office. The registration form along with the fee will be due into the UCCE office by April 23rd. Space is limited to 80 campers including chaperones, so to save your spot we are having a lay-a-away plan. Make weekly, bi-monthly, or monthly payments to have camp paid for by April 23rd. There will also be two fundraisers to help the youth to earn their camp fee, a car wash and a cookbook sale.
