This workshop will be held Monday, January 24 at the Mariposa County Library's meeting room at 5:30p.m. Dorothy Smith, UCCE Nutrition, Family & Consumer Science Advisor will be presenting this training on how to keep our food activities safe.

The University of California strongly recommends that every 4-H club and/or 4-H project holding a food service activity have at least one leader and senior 4-H members complete this training. It is a Mariposa County 4-H YDP requirement that a leader who has attended this workshop attend food service 4-H activities.

This workshop is open to the community, other organizations, and clubs. The cost is \$8.00 per participant. With this fee, attendees will receive a thermometer & vegetable brush, and hand-outs.
